MEMORIES IN LOGAN, UTAH

After my grandchildren and great-grandchildren receive the ordinances of baptism and confirmation, I take them to Logan, Utah to visit special places and become acquainted with our ancestors. We visit the Logan cemetery to learn about Philippe Cardon and his wife, Marthe Marie Tourn. Later we go to the Logan Temple. We learn of Jean Paul Cardon, a son of Philippe and Marthe. In early May of 1877 Jean (often called Paul) and some other men went up the Logan Canyon to locate a site for a sawmill to harvest lumber for construction of the Logan temple. Jean cut the first tree for the Logan temple. At the old sawmill site there is a plaque that honors Jean Cardon as the man who felled the first tree. The first board was sawn on November 4th. The mill sawed more than one million board feet. I have hiked with some of my grandchildren to the sawmill. It is an easy hike. Now there are just remnants of the mill. Logan Fork Sawmill trail length is 2.5 miles the Trailhead is 1.5 miles from the Temple Fork turnoff, which is 15 miles up Logan Canyon (0.4 miles beyond the Blind Hollow trailhead). The Logan tabernacle is a must see. Its architecture is superb. To the north of the tabernacle is a sculpture of a family pointing toward the Logan Temple. Bart Cardon was instrumental in its placement. For lunch time we go to the Bluebird Restaurant which was started by a descendant of Philippe's son, Thomas Barthelemy Cardon. I invite you to take this adventure.

When I married into the Cardon family, I had no idea the legacy I would be giving my children. I had never heard of Peter Waldo or the story of the faith, courage and persecution of the Waldensian society. Over the years I have heard and read countless stories of these stalwart people and in particular the story of Marie Madeleine Cardon. But it was Gale Sears's book, One Candle, that brought them to life for me. She wove facts into a compelling novel drawing the reader into the lives of those living in Piedmont Italy. Her descriptive writing style and her careful notes at the end of each chapter was a source of pleasure and learning, as I walked

through the pages of her book. By including Lorenzo Snow's own letters, I came to know and love Lorenzo Snow, not just as one of the missionaries in the book/story, but as a deeply, caring person who loved his family and the Lord with all his heart. From the back cover of the book: "It is 1849 – barely two years after the Saints' arrival in Utah – and missionaries are being sent out to preach the gospel to the world. One of them, Lorenzo Snow, is sent to Italy. He is led to the valleys of the Piedmont, where the Waldenese, followers of Peter Waldo, have been exiled and persecuted. There, Elder Snow and his two companions find both success and challenges. Hiking into the alpine mountains near the town of Torre Pellice, they are recognized by Madeleine Cardon, who had seen a vision of them bringing the gospel years earlier. Madeleine's best friend, Abertina Guy, faces her own challenges as her heart is drawn to this new faith. Her family is Catholic. ... Joining the Mormons could mean being expelled from her family. When Elder Snow heals her dying young brother...her family must reassess their feeling for these Mormon missionaries and the doctrine they preach." You can buy the book at Deseret Book.

EXTENDING THE STALLE LINE

By R. Lavor Cardon

Note: The Stallé in the notary records sent by Bro. Cena is spelled as Stalé, Staleo, or Stalleo. The meaning of stalliere is a stable boy. That could be interpreted to be a keeper of horses or cows. At present we have not been able to connect these people to our Cardon Stallé Line. However through more research, it is possible they are our relatives.

Colletto Stalé (b abt 1553) had a daughter Madalena (b abt 1578 in Angrogna) who married Bartholomeo Malan, son of Chiaberto son of Antonietto . Madalena and Bartholomeo had 3 children; Daniele Malan married Madalena Ponte in about 1622; Maria Malan married Gioanni Parisa in about 1623; and Michele Malan (no spouse listed). Ref #1

It is believed that Colletto Stalé had a second wife; Ludovica Bartholmeo, daughter of Batholomio Bartholomeo alia Frashia. (Ref #2) They had 2 sons; Ellia who married Maria Carbonero, daughter of Gioanni, in about 1608 and they had

a daughter Margarita who died before 22 Nov 1610. (Ref #3). The other son Daniel married Lucia Benech, daughter of Paolo and they had 7 children - Bartholomeo, Ludovica, Margarita, Gioanna, Paolo, Gioanni, & Maria (Ref #4). After Daniel's death, Lucia married Daniel Chianforano and there are no recorded children of this marriage (Ref #5) Ref #1

Background: Bro Cena has researched and sent to us the pre- 1700 notary records. He has sent us 18 volumes 118-135 from San Secondo (SS) which includes the years 1634-1712. I had an impression to have Brother Cena send us the San Secondo volumes 136 -1 that cover the years 1702-1713 and 136-2 that covers the years 1702-1718. Many of our ancestors lived in San Secondo.

New Discovery: Bro Cena had sent SS-135 and had made an error in the pedigree schematic. Brother Cena had Antonio Godin b. abt 1633 married to a Martha Godin b. abt 1637. **Antonio Godin** is the second great grandfather of Phillipe Cardon b. 1801

As I studied volume SS 136-1, I discovered that in SS 136-1 the wife of Antonio Godin b. abt 1633 to be Marta (Martara*) Saret b. abt 1637 daughter of Francesco Saret b. abt 1608 and Anna Cardon b. abt 1617. Martha Godin is not the wife of Antonio Godin. Two additional children are added to their family: **Gioanni** a son who died and a daughter **Margarita** whose husband was **Pietro-Francesco Bosio**.

The highlighted people below are new except for Antonio Godino . **Marta Saret** is the second great grandmother of Phillipe Cardon b. 1801.
