BEUS (BOSIO) NAMES FOUND AT LAST!

Thanks to the PFO and Brother Cena's research, we are now finding what promises to be hundreds of our Beus (Bosio) ancestor's names for temple work! Bartholomew Bosio b. abt 1607 (1615 estimated b. date in some versions) in Pramollo, had his work done years ago through the Piedmont Project – a name extraction program done in Ogden area in the 1940's or so. We have finally matched him up with Bartholomew Bosio found in Cena's extraction CD, created from the notarial records he is searching in the Piedmont Finding our own people has certainly enhanced my appreciation for the PFO brother Cena's work.

Italy Trip Our Rulon E. Beus (a Michael GGSon) family reunion group stayed in Torre Pellice at the Waldensian Forestaria hostel. It brought all eight children together for the first time in 50 years We thrilled at the Waldensian tours, history, hikes up to the Rock of Prophecy, to a cave where Waldensian meetings may have been held in hiding, and to abandoned homes of Pramollo perched high in the Alps, from which our common ancestors Michael Beus and wife Marianne Combs may have left when they immigrated to the Utah in 1855-56. We also thrilled to meet several 10th (or so) cousins among the Waldenses; at the vibrant, lively, interesting people they are; and at cousin Annalisa who led one of our tours.

We shared new information about our Waldensian conversions in Italy and the Beus' handcart journey of 1856. From the journal of an

Elder Frances, the corrected death date and place of little 2-month-old Joseph Beus lost to Michael and Marianne in London Dec.1855, during their journey of immigration, and Michael (poor as he was then) helped present Elder Frances with money to buy a new suit just four or five days later.

Paul Beus, with father Michael, owned and farmed the land on which the Dee Events Center now stands in Ogden; and it is they after whom Beus Park is named. This nature park maintained by Ogden City lies just up the slope from the Dee Events Center and includes intriguing nature trails and the large pond Paul and Michael made, which now holds swans, geese and ducks. We learned how 2-yr-old Magdalena Beus was carried across the plains in the handcart of Suzanne Goudin, and how both wound up married to John Paul Cardon. Beuses share in Funding Research. The Beus family has now been asked to raise \$1,000 before Christmas to help catch up the \$9,000 we owe Brother Cena. I visited with Brother Cena in Torre Pellice, and learned helpful details of the probate, lands, receipts, guardianship, and dowery records from which his name extractions come. He is fluent in both French and Italian, but not English, and was very helpful (thanks also to Annette Beus Christensen's son Burke who translated for us. Please contribute to this most worthy family work.

VACHERO-MARTHE MARIE TOURN CARDON LINE - EXTENDED

In the Piedmont Project Madeleine Reymond is the wife of Barthelemi Tourn. She is the daughter of Jacques Reymond and Madeleine Frache. Both Jacques born 1683 and Madeleine born 1686(?) were in Switzerland during the exile from 1686-1690. The Gli Esuli Valdesi lists Madeleine as a daughter of Daniel Frache and Anne Vachero. Madeleine may have been born in Switzerland during the exile(pages 95-96). Ann Vachero is the daughter of Catherine Vachero pages (173-4). The notary records gives us the maiden name of Catherine and permits us to extend the Vachero Line. TP = TORRE PELLICE

Rivoire-Monnet Ancestors: PART 1

The Rivoires actually have two MONNET ancestral lines. This article treats one of them; the other will be presented in the next issue.

Abbreviations: abt = about; Ang = Angrogna; b = born; d = died; dau = daughter; dec = deceased; Es = *Gli Esuli Valdesi* (compendium of Waldensian Exiles, 1686-1690); H: = husband; md = married; NR = notary records; PP = Piedmont Project family group record form; W: = wife; wd = will dated; wid = widow. Direct Rivoire ancestors are in **bold**. Names are in French or Italian, depending on how they appear in the records.

Judith GAUDIN's mother was **Judith AVONDET** (b 1739, Prarostino), whose paternal grandmother was **Suzanne GARDIOL** (b 1727), daughter of **Paul GARDIOL** and **Madeleine MONNET** (b 1703).

This **Madeleine MONNET** was dau of **Jean MONNET** (PP: b abt 1664, of Angrogna, son of (Elder) **Laurent MONNET**, b abt 1646) and of **Suzanne PRASSUIT** (PP: b abt 1668). Note that the PP estimated birth years for Jean and Suzanne are corrected by actual dates given in Exile records.

NOTE: Suzanne's mother Marie, in Exile, had with her a son David, (no birth year given), the above Suzanne, and a son Daniel b 1681. NR identify Maria SIMOND daughter of Susanna SIMOND (d a religious prisoner at Saluzzo in 1686) and a so-far unidentified father; Maria's mother Susanna in turn was daughter of dec Davide SIMOND. This Maria SIMOND, daughter of Susanna who in turn was daughter of Davide, was wid of Antonio PRASSUIT (d also at Saluzzo in 1686); their children included Daniel, Susanna [later, wife of Jean MONNET], and Maria, who had been kidnapped in 1686 and raised Catholic, now married and living at "Monteisello." (We must conclude that the son David had therefore died between 1687-1697.) Susanna SIMOND's sisters are identified as Gioanna SIMOND, who md a SARRET; and Margarita SIMOND, who md a GAY (Senato di Pinerolo, batch 99 [Angrogna] pg 69). More research can be done on the SIMOND and PRASSUIT lines.

NOTE: The existence of sons Georges and Michel is conjectural, but based on the firmly established Waldensian naming pattern (a couple's $1^{\rm st}$ son is named for the child's paternal grandfather; the $2^{\rm nd}$ son for the maternal grandfather; the $1^{\rm st}$ daughter for the paternal grandmother; the $2^{\rm nd}$ for the maternal grandmother.
