## A Tribute to Waldensian Mothers

*“A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping; Rachel weeping for her children refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not. (Jeremiah 31:15-16)*

Many times over the years as I've worked in the Waldensian notary records, I've felt a stab of pain for the mothers who lost children in the almost unending persecutions and disease brought in by the oppressing armies.

When I recently came across a particular act while researching a line, I felt I should use that act as a means of paying tribute to all those Waldensian mothers who lost their children solely due to the cruelty of others.

The act, a land purchase dated 20 Apr 1649, names brothers deceased Pietro, deceased Davide, and deceased Gioanni, sons of deceased Giacomo ARTUS and of Susanna CRESPIN. The act specifies that all of these brothers died in 1630 during the Bubonic Plague epidemic, brought into the Valleys by foreign troops charged with forcing the Waldensians to convert to Catholicism or die. (Bobbio Pellice vol 123 bk 1 pg 49)

What a burden that was for their mother. What a burden it was for the thousands of other Waldensian mothers who saw their children killed before their very eyes or die of foreign diseases. We indeed owe them a debt of profound gratitude.

## RIVOIRE Ancestry: the VINAY line extended

According to the family group record originating with the Piedmont Project, our Judith **VINAY**, b. abt. 1687 of Villasecca, was first married to Thomas **BERT**, b. abt. 1683, and then later married to Dr. Jacques **JAHIER**.

Notarial records now extend Judith **VINAY**'s ancestry as follows:

*Husband:* **Antony VINAY**, b. abt 1657 of San Martino Valley, Pinerolo; md abt 1680 San Martino; d. btwn 1698 and 1709.

*Gli Esuli Valdesi in Svizzera (1686-1690)* lists him as a prisoner in 1686-Feb 1687 at Torino. He was originally registered as an exile at Rolle on 18 Mar 1687, with Berne as his intended destination, but he spent 1687-1689 at **Neuchatel**. He participated in the Bourgeois expedition, but was at Neuchatel in Nov 1689 again.

*Wife:* **Marguerite MALANOT**, b. abt 1661 of Villasecca, Torino, dau. of **Rev Jean MALANOT** and **Marguerite NEGRO**.

She also is listed in *Gli Esuli*. From *I Nomi di Famiglia Delle Valli Valdesi* ...624 Negro – Chiotti XVIII sec. Da questa fam. Proveniva Margherita Negro, di Giacobbe, che ando sposa a Giovanni Malanot, una delle persone piu in vista della Val S. Martino nel XVII sec. Ebbe tre figlie e Quattro figli, dei quail uno pastore: Guglielmo e un altro chirurgo, Giovanni, che si distinse nel GR (JJ).

## BEUS Ancestry: the CAMINO line extended

Anna Camino is the 3d GGMother of our Michael Beus b. 1811, immigrant and handcart pioneer. She was born about 1625 in Pramollo, Peimonte, Italy [as NFS styles it]. With few exceptions the b. yrs given below earlier than 1671 are estimates based on other acts in the records.

### Her line back from Michael is:

1. Michael Beus b. 1811, Pramollo
2. James Beus b. 1758, Pramollo
3. Paul Beus b. 1725, Pramollo
4. Jacques Beus b. 1693 Pramol (Fr)
5. Marie Giachetto (Fr. Jacquet) b. 1671, of Pramol

Since Michael Beus b. 1811 is my 2<sup>nd</sup> GGFather, that makes Gioetto Camino here, b. 1552, my 10<sup>th</sup> GGFather. These direct ancestors, with spouses and children to the extent found, are not yet entered into NFS as I write, 6 May 2011, but I intend to put them in soon and schedule temple work.

One act records Anna's father Agostino Camino b. 1604, Pinasca, Peimonte, Italy, and follows here. [English translation in brackets]:

Valli Perosa, Italy Notarial file # 48, PG 79 R e PG 80 R e PG 82 R

COMPRA [sales]... e[and] CESSIONE [transfer] DI [of] RAGIONI [rights], 12 MAGGIO [May] 1670 Bernardino (marito [spouse] di [of] Anna fu [deceased father] Agostino CAMINO) e Allerino (marito di Ludovica fu sopra detto [above named] Agostino CAMINO), fratelli [brothers], furono [sons of deceased] Giovanni GIACHET da Pinasca.

This record also gives Anna's husband Bernardino and his father Giovanni Giachet [Giachetto or Jacquet, those notaries had trouble spelling too.]

### Showing Gioetto's son Tomaso with four of his children he still living in 1625.

# Boyd & Terri Cardon Finish Mexico City MTC Presidency

Both Terri and I are grateful for the privilege of having presided over the Mexico City MTC for the past two years. The Mexico MTC is located adjacent to the Mexico City Temple and the Mexico City Visitor's Center. It is the fourth largest of the 15 MTCs. All incoming missionaries were native Mexicans or from Latin America. New missionaries entered and left every three weeks. We had an average of 75 missionaries each cycle. All of them were assigned to the 23 Mexican missions. Most of them were 18 to 25 years old. However, we did receive 3 couples. We loved these wonderful missionaries. We had missionaries who were 4<sup>th</sup> generation members as well as recent converts who had miraculous conversion stories. Some of the missionaries were descendants of Pancho Villa ; of Rafael Monroy and Vicente Morales, who were martyred, and then the movie: "And Should we Die" was made of their ordeal., We were constantly impressed with their preparation and quality. We had a staff of 15 to 20 returned Mexican missionaries as instructors and mentors for the MTC missionaries. In total, we trained 2400 missionaries! These missionaries will return to strengthen and to establish the Church more fully in Mexico.

Another highlight of our mission was to have my brother, Neil and his wife, Sandra serving as temple missionaries in the Mexico City Temple while we were at the MTC.

For this wonderful experience we are thankful. We are glad to be home again!
