DIGITIZATION OF THE 43 MICROFILM PIEDMONT PROJECT WORKING DRAFT FAMILY GROUP RECORDS By Boyd L. Cardon

"The Waldensians (Vaudois in French and Valdese in Italian) were Protestants, many of whom lived in the Province of Torino, Piedmont Region of Italy, since the Middle Ages. They were joined by the French Huguenots during the late 1600's. In 1948 the Genealogical Society microfilmed parish records of 16 Waldensian parishes, with beginning dates from 1685 to about 1750, and as late as 1948. It was discovered that numerous families were preparing the same family group records and submitting them for temple work. To prevent duplications and to overcome language and other difficulties, persons well-versed in French were employed to put on slips of paper every birth, marriage, and death record in the approximate 65 rolls of microfilm. The data from the marriage slips were recorded on family group records by Christian Dolin, who standardized many of the surnames. This explains why the spelling of surnames in the microfilm parish registers sometimes differs from that used on the family group records and endowment cards. From January, 1961 to 31 December, 1963, a staff of approximately 20 part-time employees of the Genealogical Society (returned French missionaries, converts to the Church from France and Belgium, and students) worked under the direction of Hugh T. Law. They completed the tabulation of the family group records and connected them from one generation to another. This makes it possible in many cases for Piedmont descendants to trace their ancestry in this microfilm series, as well as in the Church Records Archives and in the Ogden Branch Genealogical Library. It is expected that the "sealings" copies of the family group records will all be filed in the Ogden Library in binders exclusively used for the Piedmont records. This microfilm collection, however, is more complete than the collection in the Church Record Archives or at the Ogden Branch Genealogical Library. This is because it includes numerous family group records which have not yet been processed for temple work. These are primarily records of modern families to whom no near relationship was determined, and records with incomplete information. Now additional individuals to the Rivoire line are given in this article. EXTENTION OF ANCESTORS OF JOSEPH SAMUEL CARDON, SON OF LOUIS PHILLIP CARDON By Lavor Cardon

BACKGROUND: **Gli Esuli in Svizzera 1686-1690** (The Waldensian Exiles in Switzerland) page 92 lists Susanne FAVAT(1232) b 1676, our direct ancestor, her father, Philippe FAVAT(1229) b 1648, her mother, Constance(1230) b 1656, and her siblings Michel(1231) b 1675, Henri(1233) b 1678, Jean(1234) b 1680, and Madeleine(1235) b 1686. In the records FAVAT is spelled FAVETTE, FATATTO, FAVATO, FAVOTO, FAVOT, and FAVODO.

METHODS USED: I use the Piedmont Project microfilms, the notary records received from Giovanni Cena and work done by Ron Malan to extend the FAVAT line.

Key: (Pg 148 Villar Pellice vol 208) indicates the notary record. *name= temple work is done.

Anna Catarina Bellion (5th great aunt), daughter of Michele Bellion and Isabellina Mehet or Maetto, was the 2nd wife of Stefano (Etienne) Frache. They had four children, Gioanna born in 1688 probably in Switzerland (Gli Esuli Valdesi line #1347), Margarita (b abt 1694), Michele (b abt 1692), and Bartholomeo (b abt 1690). Etiene's first wife was Catarina Besson, and they had three children, Bartholomeo (b abt 1677), Susanna (b abt 1680), and Paulo (b abt 1683).
