MORE NAMES OF CARDON ANCESTORS FOUND IN THE NOTARY RECORDS

BACKGROUND: The search of the notary records continue to yield results of new names of ancestors to receive the saving ordinances. The Cardon line goes extends back to Giordano Constantin b abt 1535 in RPR. Giordano had 2 sons: Henrico Constantin b abt 1560 in RPR and Hestacio Constantin b abt 1562 in RPR. In this article we find three of the children of Hestacio and his wife Margarita., namely, Agostino,. Martara; and Gioanni all b in RPR.

Agostino Constantin b abt 1589, married **Madalena Rivoire** (daughter of Giorgio Rivoire and Guilielmina Martinalgo) in abt 1613 in RPR and they had 4 children b in RPR; **Margarita** b abt 1614, **Mathea** b abt 1616, **Marta** b abt 1620 in, and **Gioanni**, b abt 1624.

Mathea md. **Gioanni Cardon** in abt 1636 and they had 4 children b in RPR; Daniele b abt 1637, Agostino b abt 1639, Gioanni b abt 1641 and Battista b abt 1643. In turn **Gioanni** md and had 5 children b in RPR; Marta b abt 1666, Madalena b abt 1668, Anna b abt 1670 and Gioanni b abt 1672. ROME VISITOR'S CENTER TO HAVE REPLICAS OF THORVALDSEN THE CHRISTUS AND THE TWELVE APOSTLES

"While visiting Italy in 2015 we were given the opportunity to visit Carrara - which is the world's capital of marble. We visited the marble quarry where the Christus for the Rome Italy Temple visitor's center was being made. It was magnificent to see this. We were also able to visit the place where the statues of the twelve apostles for the Rome Temple Visitor's Center were being finished. I was in awe at the craftsmanship and able to see God's hand in the workmanship. The detail was amazing. It was a special experience that will be treasured in my heart as I realize the impact these statues will have on the people of Italy" by Heather Cardon Weber.

Currently the Church has commissioned that replicas of the Christus and the twelve apostles be made for the Rome Visitor's center from the marble at Carrara. Michelangelo obtained his marble from Carrara. This marble is a type of white or blue-grey marble of high quality, popular for use in sculpture and building decor. It is quarried in the city of Carrara located in the province of Massa and Carrara in the Lunigiana, the northernmost tip of modern-day Tuscany, Italy. Pte. Spencer W. Kimball, after viewing the *Christus* and Thorvaldsen's *Twelve Apostles* in the Church of Our Lady, stated that "the man who created these statues was surely inspired of the Lord." On temple square the *Christus* was open for public viewing in 1967. Today there are 14 statues used in displays by the Church at the Temple Visitors' Centers in Salt Lake City, Los Angeles, New Zealand, Hawaii, Arizona, Washington D.C., Mexico City, Nauvoo, Oakland, St. George, Utah; Palmyra, New York; Hill Cumorah; Independence, Missouri From LDSLIVING
