## PFO REPORT PIEDMONT FAMILIES ORGANIZATION

DIGITIZATION OF THE 43 MICROFILM PIEDMONT PROJECT WORKING DRAFT FAMILY GROUP RECORDS AND THE TYPEWRITTEN FAMILY GROUP SHEETS IN THE OGDEN, UTAH FAMILY HISTORY CENTER.

In PFO Report Number 69, May 2016, I reported the exciting news of the digitization of the <u>Microfilm Piedmont Project Working Rough Draft of the Piedmont Project Family Group Sheets.</u>

"Piedmont Project Family Group Sheets compiled from microfilm records in the Genealogical Society of the LDS Church pertaining to the Piedmont Region Province of Torino, Italy, January 1968. This microfilm collection is more complete than the collection in the Church Records Archives or at the Ogden Branch Genealogical Library. This is because it includes numerous family group records which have not yet been processed for temple work. These are primarily records of modern families to whom no near relationship was determined, and records with incomplete information. The processed family group records are represented in this file with the letters "E" and "C" written by the names of the children." (Images 5/986 and 7/986 in the file Caabanis-Cesan 472239) Check familysearch.org to investigate if the ordinance work has been done.

Now the <u>Typewritten Piedmont Family Group Sheets</u> in the Ogden, Utah Family History center are now scanned and available and arranged alphabetically with an associated link in a spreadsheet format. Please note that "This microfilm collection is more complete than the collection in the Church Records Archives or at the Ogden Branch Genealogical Library. This is because it includes numerous family group records which have not yet been processed for temple work.

However, the advantage is that the typewritten Piedmont Family Group Sheets are easier to read. I will outline a short tutorial on how to access both the Rough Draft Piedmont Family Group Sheets and the Typewritten Piedmont Family Group Sheets.

The <u>rough draft Piedmont project family group sheets</u> are listed alphabetically that begin with Aast-Armand and end with Villot, Mr.-Zwicky, Jacques. There are 43 films. Select a film that would contain the last name of the person. These records from the microfilms are the basis and foundation of our research in identifying ancestors who need temple ordinances. The <u>rough draft Piedmont project family group sheets taken from the microfilmed Piedmont Project family group sheets are on the site:</u>

The Cardons are in the file Caabanis-Cesan 472239, the tenth listing. Go to the file Caabanis-Cesan 472239 and click on the little camera lens to the right. It will bring up film # 0079447782 with Image 1 of 986. On the left screen you see a vertical bar with a + -  $\Box$  and []. The + is zoom in, the - is zoom out, and the  $\Box$  is view a single slide. The [] is toggle full screen which populates the screen with all of the images. This is a faster way to review the family group sheets in this file. Image 9/986 is the first family group sheet.

Philippe Cardon and Jeanne Jahier are found on image 601 of 986. Philippe Cardon and Marthe Marie Tourn are on image 623 of 986.

The Cardons will be in the <u>typewritten Piedmont project family group sheets</u>; Cardon-Cavendish. The link is:

The download takes a while with StreamGate. So be patient. There are 317 images. Andre Cardon will be on the first family group sheet. Click the [] to get a one page image. You can print or Use Print Screen to copy the image

Go to image 88/317 and the family group sheet appears of Jean Cardon son of Philippe and Jeanne Jahier, and his wife Anne Jouve daughter of Daniel Jouve and Lucie Malan. Now go to image 136/317 and the family group sheet appears of Philippe Cardon son of Elder Jean Cardon and no wife and Jean Jahier, his wife daughter of Lt Bernard Jahier and Marie Robert.

The links to the typewritten Piedmont Project sheets are in a spreadsheet format arranged alphabetically. If you desire to receive a certain link, please request it of me.

CORRECTING THE CARDON PEDIGREE IN FAMILYSEARCH.ORG

I love family history. After all the research I've done concerning our phenomenal Cardon family, I feel very close to them and honor their memory. When I go to <u>familysearch.org</u> I find that the records have been changed and families changed and even some family members merged to others with the same name when there were actually two (or in some cases even 3 or 4) children with the same name. For example in the family of Jean Cardon and Anne Jouve they had four sons that they named Philippe Cardon who all died young before #5) Philippe Cardon who was born in 1801 and eventually married Marthe Marie Tourn. Someone has merged the first four Philippe's into #5). All of the sealing for these four sons were deleted from their parents.

I have made corrections to about 2 dozen families in <a href="familysearch.org">familysearch.org</a> using the rough draft Piedmont **project family group sheets** on the site. I have standardized the dates and locations and merged as many duplicates as I am certain about. See the note I have put in the "discussions" and see the Piedmont Families Organization Record I have attached in "Sources" with its explanation. Please let me know if you feel this is the best, most appropriate way to keep these records from being defiled. I have very carefully checked to see that the dates are matching for the temple ordinances and the person, but in some cases, I will need to contact family search data and have them restore the ordinances. You can go to <a href="familysearch.org">familysearch.org</a> and look.

Karen Peterson Mosley is a descendant of Philippe Cardon and Marthe Marie Tourn through Jean Paul Cardon, Joseph Emanuel Cardon, and Rula Cardon, to Virginia Christensen (her mother). She has volunteered to help correct many of the errors on <a href="familysearch.org">familysearch.org</a> on the Cardon line. Her husband's mother was a Hurst from the colonies and so she has a dual connection to the Cardons who come through Lucinda Hurst and Joseph Elmer Cardon

# EXTENTION OF ANCESTORS OF PHILIPPE CARDON, WHO IMMIGRATED TO UTAH IN 1854 By R. Lavor Cardon

Background: Research in the Notary records and <u>Gli Esuli Valdesi in Svizzera</u> continue to provide names of relatives that need the temple ordinances. The Rostan and Roman are ancestors of Philippe Cardon, who with his family immigrated to Utah in 1854. Philippe is the first cousin 4 times removed of Mateo Rostan and the 4<sup>th</sup> great grandson of Philippe Roman & Lidia Pisio. Mateo Rostan was a son of Antonio Rostan and Margarita Roman. Margarita Roman was a daughter of Philippe Roman and Lidia Pisio

Mateo Rostan (b abt 1630) and his wife Maria were among the exiled in Switzerland along with their children Antonio (b abt 1659), Michele (b abt 1667), Philippe (b abt 1670), Madalena (b abt 1682) and Mateo (b abt 1683) (#1) Mateo Rostan was the son of Antonio Rostan (b abt 1596) and Margarita Roman (b abt 1600) (#2)

Antonio Rostan (b abt 1659) first married Madalena (Plaisance) Bertalot who was previously married to a Pasquet (first name unknown) and they had a son named Paolo Pasquet (b abt 1673) (#1). Together Antonio and Madalena had a son named Mateo (b abt 1683). Antonio later married Maria Fornerone (b abt 1657) and they had a son Paolo Rostan (b abt 1699) Maria's sister Martha (b abt 1674) married Mateo Rotan the son of Antonio and Madalena Bertalot. Maria Fornerone was previously married to Gioanni DeMaria (b abt 1662) son of Andrea DeMaria and they had a son named Andrea DeMaria (b abt 1687). (#3)
