
JAMES BEUS AND CLARINDA CYNTHIA HILL

James Beus

James Beus, the son of Michael Beus and Marianne Combe Beus, was born 15 December 1840 in Pramol, Italy, which is located in the beautiful Piedmont Valley at the base of the Swiss Alps. The word "Piedmont" means "foot of the mountain", and that is where the Beus family lived, at the foot of the alpine slopes.

We know very little of the boyhood days and early life of James, but we can assume that he enjoyed his life with his family in the rural, mountainous part of sunny Italy. He attended school in the Piedmont Valley and learned both the Italian and French languages.

It was "moved and carried" by the October, 1849 general conference of the Church that "Lorenzo Snow and Joseph Toronto go on a mission to Italy." And they accordingly went and opened the door of the gospel in that nation. Progress in introducing the gospel into Italy was at first slow, that being a Catholic country, with religious liberty at the time somewhat restricted. Yet within eleven months of his departure from Salt Lake Valley, Elder Snow succeeded in effecting an organization of the church in Italy. During a sojourn in London, Elders T. B. H. Stenhouse and Jabez Woodward were added to the Italian Mission and these, with Elders Snow and Toronto, for time constituted the "Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Italy," which they, on the 19th of September 1850, in a formal manner, and with great rejoicing, organized on the summit of a mountain overlooking the Piedmont Valley, a short distance from la Tour, and which they named "Mt. Brigham." About one month later bapisms began, ultimately resulting in the organization of a branch of the church among the Waldenses at La Tour and


vicinity, with John D. Malan, president. (See A Comprehensive History of the Church, by B. H. Roberts - Vol. 3, pp 387.)

In 1855 the Beus family, along with other converts from the Waldenses emigrated to Utah. They joined the Ellsworth Handcart Company of saints, and traveled across the plains in that manner, arriving in the Salt Lake Valley 26 September 1856. For a more complete history of this emigration and Beus family's part in it see the history of Michael Beus and Marianne Combe, James' parents. James, himself, was fifteen years old at the time.

Michael and family settled in the Ogden area against the mountains, a situation somewhat similar to the one they had left in Italy, and began to make their new life among the saints. As James was the oldest son in the family, he assumed the responsibility of helping his father's family get settled in Zion. At the age of eighteen he went to work for Aaron and Lorin Farr and with his earnings helped pay for his father's farm. All the time he attended to his church duties and was advanced in the Priesthood.

As a young man he was also a member of the debating club of the Ogden Second Ward. The variety of subjects used were very educational. James learned the language of his new country fast and was a great asset to his parents, who never did learn much of the language.

During the few years from 1861 to 1863 the Church called James to make trips back East to help other immigrants come to Utah. During this time he made three trips back, and later in 1866 he made a fourth trip. A granddaughter, Cleone Beus Judkins, remembers James telling her about one of his experiences during this time. It seems that James had made friends with some of the more friendly Indian tribes along the route. On this particular trip he was going to bring back some livestock, and on the way East he met up with one of his Indian friends. They got to talking, and James told the Indian what he was doing and that he would need to find some good watering holes for the animals. The Indian agreed to meet James at a given spot and then show him a good stream. Well, it took a number of weeks for James to return to the agreed spot, but he did make it, and when he got there he waited for several days and his friend did not show up. James decided that on the next morning he would leave and find the stream on his own, so he bedded the animals down for the night. He unsaddled his horse and tied a rope around his neck and then he wrapped the other end of the rope loosely around his own waist and then put his head on the saddle and drifted off to sleep. The next morning when he awoke, all the animals were gone, including his own horse! The

rope was still around his waist, but the other end was lying on the ground.

He looked around for the livestock and his horse, but they were not to be found. So he picked up his saddle and started walking, trying to follow the trails left by the animals. After a number of hours of walking, he spotted something moving, off in the distance. As he approached he could see that it was a herd of animals, and the closer he got the more convinced he was that it was his herd. When he got close enough to really see, he spied his Indian friend standing by his saddle horse and watching the rest of the herd drink. When the Indian spotted James, he started laughing and laughing, and as James got within hearing distance the Indian said "I pull big joke on you!" Now this is how Cleone remembers her grandfather telling this story. There may be other versions, but this is the one she remembers.

In 1864 James was asked to take out his endowments in the temple so that he could be of assistance when his father, Michael, was endowed, because Michael could not speak English. Also in 1864 he drove a team to St. George, Utah for his employer, Lorin Farr, for one of President Brigham Young's preaching tours. It was a very enjoyable trip as meetings and socials were held in many towns along the way.

About this time he spent six months hauling granite for the Salt Lake Temple. In the Spring of 1865 he went to Bear Lake District to make a home -- but he came back in the fall.

In the year 1866 James made his fourth trip to the East for the Church. This time he was in the company of several other young men. They had their wagons loaded with telegraph wire for Brigham Young. Some of the settlers in the East did not want the Mormons to put up the telegraph line, so they did not want the wire to come to the Salt Lake Valley. Therefore a suit was started. The young men were under the leadership of Horton Haight, and when they were called to the witness stand to answer questions about ownership of the wire, or who hired them, all they would say was . . . "Horton Haight." The lawyers could get no other information and finally said all the boys knew was Horton Haight. They were all, therefore, dismissed and came on to Utah, arriving in October, with the wire!

On 19 October 1867 James was married to Clarinda Cynthia Hill in the Endowment House in Salt Lake City. Clarinda was the daughter of George Washington Hill and Cynthia Stewart. James and Clarinda's first home was a small two-room house on South Washington Avenue in Ogden. While living in Ogden they became the parents of six children, three of whom died in infancy and one more at age three.

In February 1877 this little home in Ogden was sold for a farm in Hooper. So with their two young sons, James R. and Michael Ezra, and daughter, Clarinda, James and Clarinda moved to Hooper. Their new home was one and one-half miles from the nearest schools, so James donated a strip of land and helped build a school house on it, which was completed in 1878. He was then made the first trustee of that district.

They were just getting a good start in their new home and farm when James received a call to go on a mission. He sold his team and wagon and rented part of his farm in preparation to leave. The man to whom he rented the farm lived in part of the house and Clarinda and her now three sons lived in the other part. They had another son born to them in Hooper whom they named Charles. On 19 April 1881 James left for the Swiss-German mission. While on this mission he kept a journal and also letters he received. The following are two of the letters he received; one from his wife, Clarinda, and one from his son, James R.

Hooperville, Utah 3 April 1881

Dear Husband,

I received yours of the 22nd stating that you had been stopped by high water. I thought perhaps you might get this before you left Liverpool. We are all well, which is enough to pay writing to let you know. The wheat is all in at last. Lucern is about knee high. Fine prospect for plenty of fruit and everything looks prosperous and encouraging.

I dreamed last night that you had come, but awoke to find you not here. I have felt a little worried since your last note, for fear some accident might happen, but trust in the Lord.

Our school is prospering. We are to have a May Day on Monday, May 2nd. I have not had the childrens' likeness taken. I shall, the first chance I can get to go to Ogden, and send them to you as soon as I get your address. Charley has got tanned so he looks quite hearty now, but I don't believe he is going to walk till you get back. I got a long letter from Richard last Saturday.

Hooperville is almost deserted of young men and boys. So many have gone to work on the railroad and some are not much bigger than our Jimmie.

Peter Moore, the murderer, was taken to Salt Lake after his examination to ----- guilty, to be admitted to jail; his father with him.

I have not heard from any of the folks neither at Ogden or Salt Lake since you left, but expect Father up here in a few days as he said he would be up in about two weeks. Will is working all the time on the place. I believe he will do well. You say in your note that you visited the day school. How do they compare with ours? I have had two notes from you; one last Saturday and one Wednesday. And I should feel more like writing if I knew you would get this. No more at present, but remain as ever. Ezra will write next time. Tell us if your health is good.

My Dear Father,

It is with pleasure that I again take my pen in hand to write you a few ones. We are all well at present and hope you are the same. We received your very welcome letter and was very glad to hear from you-that you was all well. Also me and Ezra was very much pleased to hear from you. Me and Ezra has been going to school and have been learning very fast. Uncle Lewis has been down here to visit the school. He came down last Saturday. He visited the school up in the Dobie schoolhouse in the forenoon and came down here in the afternoon. He had a real good time and Ruthinda came down with him to visit us.

The crops are looking very nice. We now have all the strawberries we want. Had a letter from Uncle Paul. He said that David Burns and Elizabeth Beus were married on May the 1st, Sunday, 1881. What relation are they to me now? We went and got our likeness taken and I don't like them one bit. But mother says they look just like me and I thought I looked lots prettier than that.

They are going to have a powder works up to Grandpa Beus' as Mr. Courtiny has rented a piece of land for the purpose. You don't know what a little git-a-bout that Charley is. He just keeps on the git all the time.

No more at present.

While in Italy James visited some of his relatives and kinsfolk whom they had left behind. They were not interested in his religion, but perhaps his visit helped to remove some of the prejudice against the Mormon people and their doctrines. He was able to gather some family genealogy. In Switzerland he was more successful, and after two years he returned home. His homecoming was in June of 1883.

The drinking water in Hooper was very poor. James read about an artesian well in southern Utah and decided to try and get one. He built a derrick and ran it with horse power. People came from near and far and laughed at him. After three months of perseverance and patience a flow of clear, cold water was struck. People then gathered around for a drink of it. This was the first flowing well in northern Utah.

In public life James was known as one who helped build school houses, meeting houses and generally liberal with his means and time in helping promote the health and happiness and general welfare of the community in which he lived. He also helped put up the first tomato canning factory in that part of the country.

His life and labors were, for the most part, spent at his home and farm work, while his public life and activity were mostly in the Church. He became senior president of his seventies quorum in about 1890, and held that position as long as his health permitted. Upon release from this calling, he was ordained a High Priest.

They had four other children born to them in Hooper. They were Charles Paul, Chloe May, Heber Hill and Iva Marian. Six of their ten children reached adulthood and were noble and honorable children.

On some of the trips across the plains James endured a great deal of exposure. This, together with other hardships, brought on inflamatory rheumatism, from which he suffered many times. Later in life he had a sun stroke and his health was poor for some time. He died 3 May 1911.

His son, James Richard Beus, said of his father: "Nobody who knew James Beus would question his faith and integrity to the gospel of Jesus Christ, as revealed from Heaven through the Prophet Joseph Smith. This faith and hope, with its doctrines and teachings, was the big factor that, above all others, influenced his life, both public and private."

Clarinda Cynthia Hill

Clarinda Cynthia Hill was born the 19th of October 1848 in the Old Fort, now Pioneer Park, Salt Lake City. She was the second child of George Washington Hill and Cynthia Stewart. On leaving Winter Quarters to come west her father and mother took their departure in a hurry. Her mother had been making cloth and so she wrapped the warp around the reed and harness and brought them along. Soon after their arrival in the Salt Lake Valley her father found three dead sheep. He took the wool from them and carried it home. Her mother washed, greased, carded and spun it into cloth. This was the cloth from which mother's first clothes were made, and her mother told us that it was the first cloth made in the Salt Lake Valley.

The family continued to live in Salt Lake City for about two years and then moved to Ogden, in 1849. While in Salt Lake City, they lived in a cabin with dirt roof and floor. It was in this house that Clarinda was born. It was often necessary to set pans and dishes on the floor and bed to catch the rain which would come through. Upon arrival in Ogden, her father first took a farm located in the southwest part of the city


where the Ogden First Ward was later located. Here he build a log house. As protection against Indians, President Brigham Young gave the order that all the people must move into the city. He moved and built a small house, using the wagon for a bedroom. This home was located on the north side of 25th Street, between Lincoln and Grant Avenue. It was in this home that Clarinda spent her girlhood days.

Clarinda's grandmother Hill had no daughters of her own, and so she took a special fancy to her sweet little granddaughter. She taught Clarinda to knit when was only three years old. This was valuable, as later on Clarinda had to knit her own stockings and stockings for the smaller children.

Clarinda's first school days were spent in an old Bowery. For seats they had a log hewn so that it was flat on the top and bottom. They had very few school books and no slates or blackboards. The first book mother owned was a first reader for which her father traded a sheep. After about two years an adobe schoolhouse was built on the corner of Grand Avenue and 24th Street. In this schoolhouse a desk was built around the wall and benches in front of it. As people were going

through the valley to California, the residents traded provisions for books, and in this way the supply of books was replenished. This constituted the school opportunities of those days.

As her father was called away from home on church work a good share of the time, the responsibility of the home rested largely on her mother. As Clarinda was the second child and oldest daughter, she was given duties seldom given to children. Breadmixing, cooking and the care of babies were often left with her at an early age. Before she was ten years old, she was taught to spin, color the yarn and assist in weaving cloth for the family. Wool was first washed, then picked apart, carded, spun and then it was ready for the weaver. When different colors were wanted in the cloth they used weeds and plants for dye. Such colors were obtained from pulsey, a week for black; weeds with a yellow flower for yellow; indigo for blue and indigo and yellow dye were mixed for green.

She also And in soap assisted making. During the winter they oak, burned quaking aspen, or any kind of hard wood other than pine. The ashes were kept, and in the spring boiling water was poured them and over after soaking for a while the water was drained off. It like then was strong lye. Greasy meat scraps and bone were added to this water and the mixture was boiled for a long time. It was then

poured into a barrel and left to harden. In this way the laundry soap was made.

During her girlhood days she joined in a variety of amusements, such as school exhibits, spelling contests and parties. Then later on, sleighing parties and dances.

She attended the first Sunday school in Weber county, and at the age of just fourteen was sustained as a Sunday School teacher. Clarinda continued in Sunday School work whenever she was able to, until 1903. At the age of nineteen she was called to teach in the Relief Society of the Ogden second ward.

On the 19th of October 1867 she was married to James Beus in the Salt Lake Endowment House, with Apostle Wilford woodruff performing the ceremony.

For ten years they made their home in Ogden, where they were surrounded by friends and relatives with whom they had many social times. Along with these were trials. In 1874 three children had diphtheria, and George W. died from it.

In 1877 their home in Ogden was sold for a farm in Hooper. This was a lonesome time for Clarinda as it was rather hard for her to get accustomed to new conditions and surroundings. To this was added another grief, for in 1879 her children were again stricken with diphtheria and their daughter, Clarinda Cynthia, died on the 5th of October of that year.

In 1881 Clarinda's husband, James, was called on a mission for the church and left the farm to a promising young man. This party stayed on the place two summers, then left. As Clarinda was alone with three small children after they left, it was very hard for her and her little family.

During this time there were occasions when Clarinda had very little to get along with. At one time provisions were scarce and she was very much discouraged. She went to a Relief Society

meeting feeling gloomy and blue. It was to be a testimony meeting, but none of the sisters seemed to feel like talking. Finally a Sister Hammer got up and began talking in tongues. Then, as no one seemed to have the interpretation, she gave it herself. Among other things she described Clarinda's circumstances and promised her that she should not want for bread again, also that things should be better for her. As Clarinda was the only one present who had a husband on a mission, she felt that it was directed to her. The promise was fulfilled, as on the way home from the meeting a neighbor asked if he could not get some flour for her, and the same evening relatives brought a few other supplies.

When Clarinda's husband, James, was superintendant of the West Hooper Sunday School, she was called upon to help plan the programs and she put on dialogues and short plays and songs.

Clarinda's religious activities were in the Relief Society, Primary and Sunday School. In 1878 she was sustained as Relief Society teacher and continued until 1886. Then again in a few years she took up the work again as teacher and also as head of the laboring teachers. This work was difficult as so few women were particularly interested. In 1887 the West Hooper Primary was organized and Clarinda was called as President, which position she held for twenty-one years. In 1888 when the East and West Hooper Sunday Schools were joined into one organization, she was called to be superintendant of the Primary department, where she labored for fourteen years. As a teacher and leader of women and children she was outstanding. In her later years many have come to her and thanked her for the things she taught them.

Along with her public work, she made a real home for her family. She was the mother of ten children, six of whom lived to maturity. In the home she taught the Gospel. Their bedtime stories were often from the Bible, Book of Mormon or church history, and they were told in such a way that they were never forgotten.

After her husband's death in 1911 Clarinda and her youngest daughter, Iva, continued on in the old home together for some time. During the winter of 1912 they went to Logan and Clarinda did temple work for six weeks. Then in 1913 and 1914 she went to Salt Lake City for a few weeks each winter and did temple work.

During 1913, as Clarinda was doing temple work, she had a number of sealings done. That night she dreamed a number of people were in her room and one couple was prominent. Some way she was made to know their names. The next day she could not seem to throw off the dream. She picked up her record book and it fell open to the page where the sealing names were taken from and there was this one couple that had been missed. She had them sealed and the dream oppressed her no more.

Clarinda and Iva soon left Hooper and moved around. In Ogden they lived in the Fifth, the Second and the Third wards. From the Ogden Third Ward they moved to Salt Lake City in 1927. There they lived in the Twenty-Second and Seventeenth Wards. Owing to her poor health Clarinda was unable to do church work for a number of years.

Clarinda died Wednesday, December 28, 1938. The following is an excerpt from the remarks of Bishop George A. Christensen at her funeral:

"...This soul here reminded me of a sister we buried two weeks ago today in Salt Lake, a pioneer just like her, and they both reminded me of this scripture. I think it is their philosophy and I feel it should be our philosophy. This is the Master, himself, speaking: 'Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word and believeth in Him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come unto condemnation, but is passed from death into life.'

"I can give you several illustrations to prove that this sister believed in that philosophy. I want to bring to your attention, too, she was going on ninety-one years of age. She was old. It was hard for her to get out to her meetings in Salt Lake and she had very little income, but, brothers and sisters, I bear testimony and the books will reveal that she believed the Lord when he said you must pay your tithing, and she did. It didn't matter whether I was bishop or Joe Richards was bishop. It didn't matter whether President Heber J. Grant was president of the church, or Joseph Smith was president of the church. She took the Lord at his word and she paid her tithing

regularly.

"Another point. I was there to see her last Sunday, my wife and I went over during the week. I stood there at her bedside, shook hands with her and she was so sick she could hardly utter a word. Yet the thing that was in her heart by habit, and by philosophy, had to be uttered. And what was that? 'Get the bishop a chair and let him sit down!' Get the bishop a chair and let him sit down. Don't you see the philosophy, the value that is there? A woman who is dying, on her deathbed, but here is a continuation of her philosophy."

JAMES RICHARD BEUS AND SUSAN PARKER

James Richard Beus

My name is James R. Beus, my wife's name is Susan Parker Beus. We have been blessed with five sons and one daughter; also with five daughters-in-law and one son-in-law; all married in God's holy temple, all of which and for which, we are very happy and thankful. We have, of this date, April, 1960, 38 grandchildren and 42 great-grandchildren, all having feelings of love and kindness for each other and all the rest of us and of doing good to their fellow men; and for all these wonderful blessings we feel doubly blessed and thankful to our Father in Heaven.

I was born in Ogden City, Weber County, Utah April 5, 1869 and of goodly parents, perhaps a little too good to me and of which I took full advantage. However they set me a good example, took me to church, sent me to school, gave me good teachings, taught me to pray, and at eight years of age I was baptized.

Soon after this my parents sold their home in Ogden and bought a farm in Hooper. We moved to Hooper in February, 1878. About this time some sad experiences overtook our family. My next younger brother, George, died of diphtheria; this was before we left Ogden, and a few months later, while living in Hooper, my younger sister, Clarinda, died of the same disease. Soon after, my next younger and only living brother, Ezra got it. I had a light case, but Ezra was bad--he had black diphtheria.

Neighbors were afraid to come. Uncle John Hill did come up the land and asked what he could do. Father told him to get a doctor, no matter what the cost. He came back an hour or so later and said that a doctor wouldn't come because it was no use. Ezra kept throwing up and we were afraid each breath would be his last. Father gathered the little family around and got the oil. He said to the family, "There is only one thing left to do now." We held a little prayer and then administered. I never had such a feeling as I had then. And I think the whole family had the same feeling. The next morning Ezra sat up to the table and ate breakfast with the family. We were very thankful and happy in the conviction that the Lord had heard and answered our prayers. Ezra is now, March 1960, eighty-six years old and the father of a fine large family and enjoying fairly good health.

The next few years we all worked on the farm. I attended school in the adobe school house, later known as Pioner Cottage, about a mile and a half distant from our home. In that building we had school, church, and practically all public gatherings. In the spring of 1881 my father was called on a mission by the Church. He sold the team of horses, wagon and some other loose properties and left for the Swiss-German mission at that time. I did chores such as feeding a couple of colts growing up for a team when father returned; a few other animals and other odd chores as they occurred on the farm and in the home. During this period, while father was on his mission, it seems that we were not over-supplied with some things desirable and, in some cases, quite important to our needs; but in an overall way, we were thankful and happy and felt that he head of the family was filling a mission that was at the call of our Father in Heaven.

In the spring of 1883, our renter found and accepted a more desirable job. I was then fourteen and Ezra nine years old. We fixed up a sort of buggy-fashioned harness, got it on one of the colts, which had already been broken into a riding pony and with an old cultivator scratched up some pieces of ground and planted some garden, also some field seeds. The field crops didn't amount to much, and were mostly replanted later.

As an example of some of my foolish showoff ways of doing things, I had broken one of the colts into a riding pony and I thought we could outrun anything that came along. One day when we, a group of boys of similar ambition, were comparing and testing our speeds, my good neighbor, Eli D. Spaulding, called me aside and gave me some good and very much needed advice. I have been thankful ever since that I was thoughtful enough to thank him and even tried to carry out

some of the advice he gave me. This is just one example of how ready I was to be associated in the foolish and sometimes sinful ways and activities common to our day. I am very grateful for one thing, I said in the beginning that I was born of goodly parents who taught me the right way of living, and having now somewhat passed my ninetieth birthday, I find myself a bit given to thinking about and reviewing some of the earlier events and activities of my past life, and some with much regret; but, however, with a deep sense of gratitude to my Heavenly Father, who has been so good to me. It seems to me that I always had a testimony of the truthfulness of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and that Joseph Smith was a Prophet of God. In my early teens I decided to read the Book of Mormon through, and doing so I received, what to me, was a very satisfactory and impressive testimony of the divinity of that book. One more impressive experience, early in boyhood on being sent out on an errand at night, going to a night meeting or otherwise at night and having no phones or autos in those days, walking a mile or two was quite common; it might be of interest to note that sometimes some of the boys walked from Hooper to Ogden to attend school, a distance of about ten miles from where we then lived. On some of these experiences, at night, I would seem a bit intimidated at the darkness of the night. This is my story: In such cases of my intimidations, when I would recite and keep reciting the first verse of the hymn, "We Thank Thee O God for a Prophet," all fear seemed to leave me, and I could go on my way quite happy and undisturbed. In fact sincere prayer seems to bring a very good answer to troubles, trials, afflictions and even all the problems of life.

Thinking of sports and amusements, I recall that when I was well along in my teens, I was privileged to go to a dance for the first time in a ward outside of our own. This was quite an adventure and one much talked about. Of course, we had our mutuals and our Sunday school and aside from these we had some sports and games of our own making. One was to assemble on a nearby corner and with a good sized fire roast potatoes, play run-sheep and other games. We also had swimming places, one up in the canal and one over to the river.

I believe I am right in saying we never went out stealing and smashing watermelons; they were too much needed and scarce and we never went out breaking windowpanes in the church. We had no money to make replacements. We were very thankful to find a little work away from home to make a little money.

Following my thirteenth birthday, in the fall, I went out hand-binding grain following the self-rake or dropper machines, ten or more hours per day; and when that was over, following the threshing machines, stacking straw; no blowers on the machines in those days; and pitching grain on the table of the machines, generally throughout the grain harvesting season. Maybe we were rather good boys because we couldn't do otherwise. For this work, generally, I received one bushel of wheat per day.

On the market this wheat sold for Fifty to Sixty cents per bushel.

In the winter time, "Oh how the sleigh bells did ring." The fastest teams were well known. In all, however, we lacked much of the temptations, allurements and indulgences of 1959 and 1960. However, the fundamentals and standards of righteous living, with their attendant results, remain the same; they do not change. Someone has said our Father in Heaven does not delight in destroying people and nations for their sins. They are all His children and He warns them of the result of unrighteous living.

Father returned from his mission in June, 1883. For the next few years I worked on the farm with father and Ezra and attended school in Hooper. Having now graduated from the Hooper

school, my parents suggested that I attend school in Ogden. This pleased me, so he arranged for me to board with Uncle Richard Hill, who lived on Washington Avenue about a mile and a quarter from the Odgen Central School. Prof. T. B. Lewis was principal, with Prof. Mosiah Hall, assistants, and other instructors. This was for the school year 1886-7. It was probably in the later summer and early fall of 1887 that David Spaulding and I took a job of gathering, wheeling and piling salt from the salt ponds on the old Gwilliam property south of Hooper; this to help supply funds so I could go to school. As I remember, it was for the school years 1887-88 and 1888-89 that arrangements were made and Emory Soule and I lodged and boarded with Aunt Ruthinda Monch for the two school years at the same school. Following this, perhaps school teachers were not too plentiful and Emory and I both were encouraged to take on teaching for the next school year, 1889-90.

Emory took a school in Box Elder County and I taught in Hooper. Eli D. Spaulding was trustee in Hooper and Edward H. Anderson was Superintendent of Weber County Schools. The fall of 1890 was one long to be remembered by me. My school companion and associate was stricken with typhoid fever and died. I always regarded Emory as my superior. In school, in athletics and in personality, Emory was tops. He had high ideals. I loved him very much. I have since felt that our Father in Heaven had a finer and better field of activity for him. For the school year 1890-91, I taught school again in Hooper. We had an enrollment of about 75 with all eight The students after class recitation and grades. explanations, had generally to work out their own problems. In the summer of 1891 I was called by the Church to go on a mission to the Swiss-German Mission: but through a mistake in my transport papers, I was sent and spent about two years in Ireland.

[J. R. spent much of his time alone in the Londonderry district. He worked in the office also. He said of that time: "I boarded with a lady that kept a boarding house. I kept myself for \$25 a month. Sometimes I would walk 100 miles from Londonderry to Belfast in three days. At noon I would stop at a farmhouse to drink some buttermilk, some of which was strong enough to make a pig squeal. Some months we ate nothing but potatoes, because they were cheap food." A lady in Londonderry gave him a very urgent invitation to hold a meeting at her

home. He arrived at the meeting only to find out that the minister boarded there. He held some meetings, doing all the talking, as the minister did not take part. J. R. says, "I didn't convert anyone, but baptized several." One of his contacts, a girl named Rebecca later joined the church and came to Utah. -Ed.]

I have always felt that in this mission there was more given to me than I was instrumental in giving to others. In early September of 1893, I found myself back in home environment. I was appointed principal of the Hooper school. We now had two primary schools, one in the East and one in the Western part of the Ward. They had the first four grades and the beginners, while the 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grades were held in a larger building in the more central part of the Ward. I quite enjoyed this work for the next few years.

On April 23, 1896, Susan Parker and I were married in the Salt Lake Temple. I taught school in Huntsville, beginning about January 1, 1901, and again in the school year 1901-02. another impressive experience. It was in the fall and winter of 1919-1920, I was then acting Bishop of the Hooper Ward. There was a bad and often fatal spread of what was called the "flu" spread pretty well throughout the United states. It seemed that Utah had its full share of this malady. The dead

came along so fast that the mortuary people and the doctors got so far back in their work that sometimes a doctor wasn't available and even the dead had to lie without treatment and care for some days. I well remember that Elder David O. McKay told us bishops to make a cloth bib or mask and let it hang from just below the eyes and go right into all such cases and take care of them the very best we could, and the Lord would bless us and we would not take the disease. The promise, so far as I know, was fully realized. Our own Hooper Ward seemed to have its full share of just such cases. Sometimes a little funeral service was held out in the open, just in front of the home.

I feel that these, and other experiences, should and have given me a very good testimony and witness that there is a great, mighty, just and loving Father in Heaven, who has, by and through, and in accordance with eternal laws of justice, mercy, love and truth, provide for, and also in like manner controls the life and destiny of man. These wonderful blessings--the resurrection and opportunities of exaltation--are provided and made available to mankind by and through the atonement of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. While all mankind will be resurrected, exaltation is attained through and by obedience to the laws, ordinances and teachings of the Gospel of Jesus Christ; that Joseph Smith was and is His Prophet, who was instrumental in God's hands in restoring to earth what is now known as the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. That this great Church has in its leadership Prophets, Seers and Revelators, appointed and ordained of God to teach and direct in all the affairs of His Church until He comes whose right it is to reign; that this Church teaches, and has within it, the true way of life and living whereby mankind may obtain Eternal Life and happiness, God's greatest gift to man.

James R. and Susan raised six children: James Levi, Rodney Parker, Rulon Edwin, Susan Cleone, Evan Hugh and Jay Richard.

He was active in public and local affairs and was instrumental in the establishment of the Weber Central Dairy. In 1924 the county agents were introducing cooperatives. They met much opposition. J. R. was asked to help get one started in Weber County, which he did, becoming its first president.

Culminating his many years of service to the community a testimonial dinner was held in his name. Many people attended, among them Pres. George Albert Smith of the Latter-day Saint Church, who honored Mr. Beus "for achievements for the good of his fellows" and his "rearing of 6 valuable citizens." Frank Evans, Attorney for the Dairy Association, Ezra Taft Benson, member of the Latter-day Saint Council of Twelve Apostles, and Dr. W. Preston Thomas, Agricultural Economist at Utah State Agricultural College.

At that dinner a portrait of J. R. Beus was unveiled, which today hangs in the offices of Weber Central Dairy.

Susan Parker

Susan Parker Beus was born in a two-room adobe house in Hooper, Weber Co., Utah on December 15, 1874. Her parents were Edwin Parker and Catherine Cox Parker and she was their third child. She was such a small child that she was blessed and given the name, Mary Maria, that night. (These names were the names of her grandmothers.) Her name was later changed to Susan.

She made her first long wagon trip to Sandy, Utah when she was just one year old. She cried and had to be carried by her father.

She attended grade school in Hooper in a little one-room frame building with a large stove in the center of the room. She carried her lunch in a lard bucket which was placed in the windows until noon. Many times her lunch would be frozen when it was time to eat.

The family attended church in Hooper, where her father was bishop for ten years. When the

boundaries were moved they were in North Hooper, which made the church house close for parties.

When Susan was twelve they moved into a three-bedroom house. She worked in the Sunday school with the young children and attended Mutual Improvement Association meetings. They walked a little over a mile to church.

Many things occupied her time. She was the "baby-sitter" for her ten younger brothers and sisters. She spent some time staying with her Grandmother cox. She picked strawberries for twenty-five cents a half day. She helped her neighbors do their washing and can remember carrying water from a nearby ditch and let it stand for the dirt to settle. They would then heat it and wash by hand on a scrubbing board. She worked for some of her aunts and earned \$2.50 a week.

Realizing that all work and no play make Jill a dull girl there was recreation too. She sang in the ward choir at the age of 17. Henry Sole walked her home after choir practice once and tried to put his arm around her. They were walking on a ditch bank, and much to his surprise, Henry Sole landed in the ditch.

On the Fourth of July they held a big celebration. They held a program in the Bowery and later boards were put down for some dancing. Susan was thrilled one Fourth of July when she could buy a new hat.

Her father sent to England for an organ when she was a year old. It was the only one in Hooper, or Hooperville, as it was called then. They often loaded it onto the wagon and took it to dances. Susan recalls, "Father would chord on it and John Stoddard played the violin." Susan went to many of those dances on horseback, riding side-saddle.

Her folks did quite a bit with the entertainment in the ward. Her father led the first choir in Hooper, with only a tuning fork as accompaniment. Plays were the main entertainment. Susan's mother took many parts and Susan was often left as the baby tender back stage when her mother was in the play.

In the winter she often went sleigh riding with different fellows. Once she was riding with Ron Thompson when the horses went off in the barrow pit. Straw, quilts and boys and girls went sprawling all over. Ron asked concernedly, "Sue, are you alright?" They all had a good laugh when they found that no one was hurt. In the summer the young people in Hooper enjoyed horse racing.

The main meal of the Parker family was molasses, bread and milk, or lumpy dick and sorghum. In the summer they dried potatoes, peaches, apples, and apricots. Mr. Parker had bees, so they had plenty of honey. They raised sugar cane and made molasses. They picked berries for Thompsons, which were shipped to Evanston, Wyoming. Mrs. Parker made all the clothes for the family.

In 1893 Susan journeyed with Nate Baker to Salt Lake to attend the dedication of the Salt Lake Temple. It took a day to drive by wagon and horses. They took food and bedding and camped in Salt Lake for two nights. They took a tent for the girls to sleep in, but the boys slept outside under the stars. On the day of the dedication there was a most terrible wind and dust storm. Flocks of seagulls hovered around the spires of the temple as if to be protecting it.

Jim Beus started courting Susan after his mission. Many of the girls had "set their caps" for him, but after six months of walking Susan home from MIA and choir, Jim decided Susan was his girl and asked her to marry him.

They traveled to Salt Lake by train one day and stayed at Aunt Fanny Hill's place. On April 23, 1896 they were married in the Salt Lake Temple. They went back to Hooper that night where Susan's mother had prepared a lovely supper for them. The next night they had a wedding dance in the old hall. They moved into a red brick home which had just been built. They furnished it with a bedroom set, table and chairs, a cook stove, and a bookcase.

A son J. Levi, was born to them February 7, 1897. Their other children were Rodney, born 11 April 1900; Rulon, born 2 November, 1903; Cleone, born 8 May 1906; Evan, born 15 March 1910; and Jay, born 16 July 1916.

Before Evan was born they moved into a new house across from the cemetery.

Susan spent a lot of time in service to others. One summer after being weak with sickness herself, she took care of her Aunt Mary in her own (Susan's) home. She had her about fourteen months until Aunt Mary's death. She took care of Grandma Beus for for twenty months, while

Jim's sister, Iva was on a mission. Ninety-two year old Grandfather Parker lived with her until his death.

Susan tells of one experience of helping neighbors when they had the flu. The Relief society sisters took turns staying with the Stoddards when they had the flu. The Stoddards had fourteen children-one was away from home and one of the children at home didn't have the flu. That young boy was really a big help. He packed water and did other chores.

One night one of the boys had severe nose bleed. They needed some cotton to plug it. One of the older girls in the family said that they just didn't have any, so Susan cut a hole in a new quilt and got some cotton batting from it to stuff the boy's nose.

Honey candy with cayenne pepper was given the children for their coughs. Many times Susan has felt and known the influence of the power of prayer. In 1907, when they moved into their second home, they had to pack water from the cemetery. Jim was going to Salt Lake to get pipe to dig a well. He couldn't find his checkbook and Susan prayed to be shown where it was. She walked into the bedroom and picked it up.

Before Evan was born in 1910, Susan was sick most of the time. Jim was on the High Council at the time. On this one day he had a meeting. He asked her if he should go. She answered affirmatively. After he left, she got worse. She said out loud, "Oh, Heavenly Father, what should I do?" A voice said to her, "Get help!". She sent Levi over to the neighbor's to phone the doctor, who was on the High Council, too, and to get his father. They finally got word to the doctor's wife and she, in turn, got the doctor.

She sent Cleone and Rulon to stay at Aunt Nellie's for awhile. The roads were pretty poor at that time of the year. Susan recalls, "When Jim came home I was sitting up in a chair. I never will forget how he came in and said, 'I thought you were sick,' and I told him I was."

Evan was born that night. She had been sick because she had been carrying one dead baby for four or five months. At this time she temporarily lost the use of her left leg. Her leg still bothers her when she sits very long.

Jim was Bishop for ten years in Hooper Ward. When he was released they gave him a gold watch. Susan went down to Nell's to help her shell peas. Jim came down and told her he had had a piece of bad luck that day. He had been cultivating raspberries and had lost his gold watch. They searched over the patch several days. They raked over it, in hopes of recovering the watch. One day the men were down in the pasture tending cows. Susan prayed that

she might be able to find the watch. She went right to the place where it was and picked it up. Jim told her, "I looked in that place a dozen times."

Susan and Jim Beus reared a good family who remained very close to the Church. They are faithful, active members, who have also raised their families to stay close to the Church. Susan lost her beloved Jim 4 June 1967, and the loss affected her to the point that after about six months, she moved in with her daughter Cleone Judkins. Susan died 18 June 1969 in Hooper, Utah.



MICHAEL EZRA BEUS AND OLIVE REBECCA BAKER

Michael Ezra Beus

Michael Ezra Beus was born March 7, 1874 at Ogden, Weber County, Utah, in a small two-room home on South Washington Avenue. His father, James Beus, and mother, Clarinda Cynthia Hill, moved from the small home to another in Hooper in 1877. The home was located one and one-half miles from the school.

Ezra was baptized June 1, 1882.

His father, James, was called to the Swiss-Italian Mission, leaving behind his wife and three sons. While he was gone, many things in life were difficult for their family. Because of their great faith, this period was a character-building time for Michael Ezra. The following are three short letters he wrote to his father, James in Switzerland in 1881 and 1882, when Ezra was 11 and 12 years old:

My Dear Father,

It is with pleasure that I take my pen in hand to write you a few lines to let you know that I remember you. I am going to school every Friday afternoon. I am reading in the region reader and learning to read good. We are having a good time, but we would like to see you. Oh, yes, and I found two nests full of eggs. One with 15 and one with 20.

And Uncle Richard will be home in about three weeks and mother says if we will be good boys

she will take us to Ogden when he comes and make a good visit. We haven't been there many times since you went away.

But my part is full. No more til next time.

My Dear Father,

I received your present for the New Year. Guess which one I got? The red one. We just had a good dance. All of them was little children and we had a good time and we danced like fun. Mother gave me a pair of britches and boots for a Christmas present. Good-bye.

During a siege of diphtheria Ezra contracted the disease along with the other children. He was very low and as the quarantine was really strict, no one could leave the house or have others come in for help. His uncle, John Hill, came part way up the lane and offered help. He called the family doctor at Ogden and explained the condition of Ezra. The doctor said the child was too far gone and he could do no good by coming out to Hooper. That evening the family all went in and knelt around the bed and prayed for divine his assistance. Then father administered to him and they stayed around the bed all night. In the morning Ezra revived, sat up and ate, making a complete recovery. This was a most remarkable incident as the spirit of healing and faith was strongly felt by all members of the family.

Ezra met his sweetheart, Olive Rebecca Baker, and married her in the

Salt Lake Temple on December 7, 1893. They lived in Hooper until 1896, when they moved to Clinton. Ezra was a progressive man. He was able to visualize readily many of society's new inventions and was able to adapt them into his own home life. He was one of the first to have electric power in his area and had to buy extra shares to get it.

Ezra served in Clinton's first Sunday School Superintendency from May 20, 1899 to November 8, 1914. He was a good provider and the most loving, generous, self-sacrificing father in the world.

His wife, Olive, served 16 years in the Relief Society presidency. She and Ezra kept three sons in the mission field. They reared ten children -- three boys, George, William and Ersel, and seven daughters, Hazel, Alta, Pearl, Ethel, VaNeta, Bessie, and Lucille.

Ezra died in his home in Clinton, March 1, 1963. He remained true and faithful to his testimony to the end.

Olive Rebecca Baker

Olive Rebecca Baker was born 9 March 1876 at Hooper, Weber County, Utah. She was the fifth child born to William E. Baker and Esther Celestia Cole. She had seven sisters and five brothers. She attended school in the Hooper South school, which was located one-half mile south of the center of town, until she was sixteen years old. She especially liked advanced reading.

Her father never allowed the children to work outside the home because with thirteen children

Although her husband Michael Ezra Beus was also raised in Hooper, they had little opportunity to meet, since there was more than one school and more than one church building in Hooper, and they did not attend the same ones.

A dance hall was built, which assisted greatly in courting. When she was fifteen and a half Ezra approached her at a dance and made a date for the following Sunday. All activity in the small town was centered around the Church and the Sunday date was to take her to church. They became engaged to be married a year later.

The highlight of their courtship was a two-day trip to Salt Lake City to the dedication of the Salt Lake Temple, in 1893. They traveled as far as Farmington, Utah, where they camped overnight and completed the trip on to Salt Lake City the next day. By horse and wagon it required two days from Hooper to Salt Lake City. The return trip was similar. This, of course, required chaperones.

She became Mrs. Michael Ezra Beus on December 7th 1893 when they were married in the Salt Lake Temple, after two years of dating.

They lived in Hooper two years after their marriage, and then moved to Clinton, Utah. After another two years living near the bamburger tracks they moved their home to a piece of land her father gave them located one-half mile west and one-half mile north of the underpass. In this location they were closer to neighbors and family and were not bothered by tramps riding the tracks, as they had been.

She was the mother of ten children. George was born in Hooper; Hazel and Alta were born while living near the tracks; Pearl, Ethel, Bill, Neta, Ersel, Bessie, and Lucile were born in the new location. Olive and Ezra lived to celebrate their 67th wedding anniversary in that home.

When her father gave her the property he told her never to sell it and it would always be security for her. She took great stock in what he said and would never sell it or allow a mortgage or loan on it. Even when things were rough she would not change her mind. Many were the offers from friends, relatives, and strangers. Before she died, the place was worth several thousand dollars, but that did not sway her at all.

She spoke very little about her childhood and her brothers and sisters, but seemed to hold them in high regard. It was not unusual to see tears in her eyes and have her explain that her family was leaving her as the years passed.

Olive was a beautifully dainty quilter, as were her daughters. In 1935 Ezra bought some material and Ethel Pieced it into a quilt top of "Sun Burst" design. When it was quilted it took first place in the Davis County Fair.

Her crocheting was a thing of beauty. The exactness of every stitch is impressive. Not all of her girls took up crocheting, but of those who did the dainty exactness is evident.

She sewed clothes for her children and was a firm believer in canning. Even in later years she saw to it that the cellar was well stocked with jars of fruit.

She served in the Clinton Ward Relief Society presidency for sixteen years. Her father was known to continually assist the sick and the needy. When she was called to care for the sick or assist in a death she went without hesitation, even in contagious conditions. She said her father always said "if we will go and do our duty and help the sick, we would never carry the disease to our children," and she knew that was true. It is said she took sunshine into every home she visited.

The children testify of the peace and joy in the home. Negative talk was always discouraged. Never was a cross word spoken between her and Ezra.

The Beus family are known throughout the area as hard, diligent and fast workers. The children say it is because they would run races with each other as they worked in the fields just to see who could plant, hoe, or harvest the fastest and the best. This made work a joy.

Olive died at the age of 85 years in her home in Clinton. Her mind was alert to the very end. She dearly loved the Lord and sought to serve Him all her days. Through her righteous teachings, three sons served missions and all ten children were married in the temple. She indeed set an example befitting a Mormon mother.

CHARLES PAUL BEUS AND LAURA SOPHIA DIEU

Charles Paul Beus

I was born January 29, 1880, in the town of Hooper, Weber County, Utah, and was given the name Charles Paul Beus, on April 1, 1880 by my father, James Beus, in the Hooper Ward chapel.

The first recollection of my childhood is the day I met my father. Shortly after I was blessed, father was called on a mission to Europe. This was before I could recognize him. In the spring of 1883, he returned home, having filled an honorable mission. My mother, my oldest brother, James, who drove the horse and carriage, and I met him at the station. I was in my third year at the time.

My childhood days were spent on a small farm in the western part of Hooper. Being the fifth child of eight, it was necessary that I help Mother and Dad provide a living, and many long hours were spent working in the fields with my brothers.

However, time is always found by young boys to entertain themselves, and we found such entertainment in ball games, fishing and swimming trips down the Weber River during the summer, and horseback riding, reading and ice skating during the winter.

The main fish caught was Carp. Because we did not care too much for it, I did not take as much interest in fishing as I did in swimming. One day I was playing with some older boys and they threw me into a whirl pool (known as the Bear Hole), on the Weber River. Due to my swimming accomplishments, I managed to make it to the river bank.

When about eight or nine years of age, a fair was held to raise money for the purpose of building the first Hooper church house. I decided to buy a ticket and take a chance on a one-horse buggy and harness which was to be given away. Much to everyone's astonishment, I won the prize. Father could not see how a boy would derive much benefit from a one-horse buggy and harness and he directed me to give it back to be sold to the highest bidder.

I received my early schooling in a one-room schoolhouse. The land on which it was built had been donated by my father and was situated on the southwest corner of our land. The first instructor was D. H. Bevans. All eight grades were taught in the school, and the students ranged in age from beginners to grown men and women. Mr. Cragin was my first teacher. Day school activities were somewhat handicapped in my early life, and I would like to relate the following experience to explain why:

We harvested quite a lot of alfalfa. Father often hired help during the summer months. This particular summer he hired a man named William Warren. One hot afternoon, father, James and the hired man were out piling alfalfa in the field. I was sent to take them a cold drink. After delivering the water, I found what looked like the shady side of a pile of hay and sat down. The cool smell of freshly-cut hay and the heat of the afternoon sun overtook me and I dropped off to sleep. The older men finished piling the alfalfa and returned to the house. Upon their arrival, mother asked them where I was. Father said he didn't know and continued that I had brought them a drink, but that was the last they had seen of me. They then began hunting for me through the fields. About sundown I was found unconscious at the foot of a pile of hay. The next I remember, I was home in bed being treated with damp cool cloths. Instead of choosing the shady side of the hay, I had chosen the sunny side and received a sunstroke.

This caused me to have many dizzy spells and headaches thereafter, and I could not attend school as much as I wished. However, James became a school teacher, and it was from him that I received much of my early training.

One Christmas morning, Lee Naisbett, a friend of mine, and I decided to go horseback riding. After saddling my horse and riding to meet him, we galloped off together through the pastures. Our horses began trotting on a piece of ground that was covered with marshy salt grass. My horse lost its footing, slipped and fell down. It then rolled over on its back and before I could get out from under its weight, the horn of the saddle caught me on the instep of my foot, making a deep gash which caused me to be laid up until spring.

The Hooper school was finally graded, and I completed the 8th grade. In 1898, I entered Weber Academy, which is now called Weber State College, Ogden, Utah. At that

time David O. McKay taught the Book of Mormon and first-year classes. It was from him that I gained many impressive lessons. The academy was very enjoyable, especially the debating classes with Oscar Geertsen. Because of my good progress, I was elected to give the valedictorian talk at our graduation in 1899.

In the fall of 1899, I attended the Brigham Young Academy, which is now Brigham Young University, at Provo, Utah. I lived with my Uncle Richard Hill's family. George R. and Reuben Hill, my cousins, and I drove back and forth from Springville to Provo to attend school that winter. The most impressive teachings received at the Academy were given by George R. Brimhall in second year theology class.

I began my church activities very young, and this I attribute to the wonderful teachings and guidance received from my parents. It was from the teaching of my mother that I gained an inclination towards religious thinking. Her instructions and examples lead me towards service to others. The thought that father walked across the plains always impressed me, and I felt that if he could endure that, I could and should live my religion to the best of my ability.

Mrs. Arve was my first Sunday school teacher. She joined the Church in Illinois, before Joseph Smith was martyred, and brought her students many vivid memories of early church history. Her teachings instilled within me a testimony of the gospel of Jesus Christ that has continually grown throughout my life. Mother was the president of the first Primary in Hooper. I remember well the lessons received under her guidance, and that of other teachers, such as Sister Arave and Sister Naisbett.

Having goodly parents, I was baptized in the north branch of the Hooper Canal on July 5, 1888, by Oley C. Oleson. At that time Fast Meeting was held on Thursdays and we met in an adobe hall. It was here that I was confirmed a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, by

Emory W. Soule.

At the age of fifteen, I received the Aaronic Priesthood. On April 31, 1895, I was ordained a deacon by my oldest brother, James R. Beus. My ordination to a teacher in the Aaronic Priesthood from Oley C. Oleson was on March 11, 1897. It was my privilege to become Sunday School Librarian in 1899 and take care of the Sunday School song books for the Hooper Ward.

In the summer of 1900 I took mother to Springville to visit Grandmother Hill, who was living with Uncle Richard Hill and his two wives, Aunt Nancy and Aunt Charity. On the way to Salt Lake, mother asked me if I would like to stop at the Church Patriarch's office and receive a

patriarchal blessing, which I did.

I received my call to go on a mission September 12, 1900. This date I particularly remember because of an incident that happened in my theology class at the Brigham Young Academy: I was in a class of about 50 or 70 students. Mr. Brimhall, our teacher, had a habit of running his fingers through his hair. If everything was going along just fine, his hair would be roughed up. When his hair was very well groomed, we knew we had better be on guard, because it was direct indication that he was in a sharp mood. On this particular day, I didn't take notice of his hair until I saw him standing over my desk saying, "Young man, get your thoughts back in this room and not a thousand miles from here." My thoughts were about the message I had received to be in Salt Lake City on the 24th of October to be assigned a field of labor preparatory to leaving the following day for the mission field.

Shortly after this, Charles D. Evans, patriarch of the Utah Stake, came to Uncle Richard's place and gave me a second patriarchal blessing. This blessing has also served as a comforter and testimony to me throughout my life. The phrase, "... thou shalt speak the tongue of a people unknown to thee," stood out in my memory during the following days, and I pondered as to whom these people were and what language I would learn.

In Salt Lake I was ordained to the office of a Seventy in the Melchizedek Priesthood and set apart to go on a mission to the Netherlands, by Christian D. Feltstad, on October 24, 1900. This ordination especially stands out as one of the most wonderful experiences of my life. Christian D. Feltstad was such an ideal person. He served as president of the First Council of Seventies.

Some thirty-two young men were called to the mission field that day. Because I was the only one of this group to be sent to Europe, my departure was put off until November 7, 1900. On this date I left in a company of about thirty elders bound for the European missions.

At mission headquarters in Rotterdam, Holland, I was met by Sylvester Q. Cannon, president of

the Netherland-Belgium Mission and assigned to the Liege, Belgium conference.

Elder David P. Cheney, who had arrived there a few weeks ahead of me was assigned as my companion. We labored together in the country of Belgium for about two years - from 1901 to 1903. In the latter part of 1902 Elder Willard Cannon and Elder George Paul labored with us.

I had many very valuable experiences while studying the language of the French-speaking people. After being on my mission for about six months, I was called by President Cannon to be president of the Liege Conference. In the following paragraphs I would like to relate a few of the

many impressive events that occurred during my missionary labors:

A very faith-promoting incident transpired at the death of my companion, Elder Henry R. James, on 10 October 1901, at Liege. It was the task for Elder Cheney and me to prepare the remains of our partner for the return home to Utah. We accomplished this task however, and I accompanied the remains from Liege to Rotterdam, Holland, by way of Rosendol. They were then taken over by President Cannon, and Elder Urdly accompanied them from Rotterdam to Utah.

We had prepared the remains under the direction of President Francis M. Lyman and with the guidance of the American Consulor, Mr. Winslow, who was located at Liege, Belgium. Doing this was in violation of the orders of the city officials at Liege. They became upset about me taking the body away. They had ordered it buried there. Because of my disobeying their orders, a \$500 reward was offered for my capture.

Elder Cheney was quite worried about it. When I arrived home, he warned me of this reward

for my capture and told me it would be better not to stay in Liege but to hide elsewhere. I told him I had nothing to hide. While we were eating breakfast the next day, officers came to arrest me and began to put handcuffs on me. I stood up and spoke to them, "Now listen gentlemen, I want to talk to the head of the American Consul, Mr. Winslow. I have nothing to fear. I acted under the direction of the American Government."

This rather frightened the officers and they took me to police headquarters. When I told the magistrate that I desired counsel from Mr. Winslow, he told them I was right. He requested them to release me and have me appear in a day or two with Mr. Winslow. I was released on my honor and when the time came, Mr. Winslow and I appeared. Mr. Winslow told them what had happened and that I had acted strictly under the advice of the American government and they should not press charges. My faith did not fail me. The Lord guided and protected me and I was not committed to prison although I had gone against the rules of the country.

Through study, effort, and a miracle, a Mr. Joseph Dieu was converted to the true gospel. Joseph had a great desire to read the Book of Mormon and when hands were laid upon his head, confirming him a member of the Church he was promised that the gift of reading the Book of Mormon would be realized. This blessing was fulfilled when he read parts of the Book of Mormon to his cousin, Alponse Dieu.

Alfonse Dieu and his family also investigated the church and were considering baptism. He weighed 270 pounds, and could not do heavy work. He, there, became a shoemaker. He worked very hard and into the long hours of the night to provide a living for his wife and seven children. When he learned about the principle of tithing, he wondered where he could squeeze out another ten per cent of his earnings and questioned the Elders about it. On this particular day, I was called out of the city to attend a conference in another part of the mission. Elder Cheney visited the Dieu family and Brother Dieu inquired about the principle of tithing. Elder Cheney explained that the Lord required that we pay one-tenth of our income to him and he further stated that if he, Brother Dieu, could not pay a full ten per cent, he had better not be baptized.

Upon my return from the conference, something told me to visit the Dieu family. I did and found the old gentleman very busy, but he said that he wanted to see me. He stated that he couldn't meet the ten percent tithing. The family had made up their minds that if I couldn't give them a better answer than Elder Cheney had given them, they would not be baptized.

I explained to him that not everyone could pay ten percent, but that he should accept it as a principle of the gospel and that under the blessings of the Lord, he would be able to accomplish the desires of his heart. I promised him that if he accepted this principle of the gospel, Joseph Smith as a true prophet and Christ as the Savior of the world that the way would be opened, little by little, for him to live this principle.

The way was opened up for him a few years later to emigrate to America. The fact that he was soon able to pay a full tithing, and later died owning his own home was a testimony of his faithfulness in seeking to live the principles of the gospel.

Sister Dieu also gained a vivid testimony through a vision in which she saw a group of men. They advised her to join the Church. As she described them to me, I recognized President Joseph F. Smith and his two counselors. I had a folder with their picture in it at the mission home which I took to her. Immediately upon my showing her the picture, she recognized them and said they were the ones that had appeared to her. I also advised her to join the Church and do the best she could and the Lord would bless her.

Through their joining the Church, we were successful in making many more friends and in having the opportunity of presenting the gospel to them.

I received my release on June 13, 1903 and my mission came to a close with a testimony of the restored gospel of Jesus Christ that has never, nor will ever, leave my bosom.

I had helped to convert some very wonderful people and also made many valuable contacts and friends. I would like especially to mention one beauteous young lady, Laura S. Dieu, the daughter

of Brother and Sister Alphonse Dieu, who has made a lasting impression on me and has affected my life a great deal. Before I left Belgium, I approached Brother Dieu and requested that his daughter Laura accompany me to America. I told him that I felt a very warm affection of love for her simplicity and beauty of life. I further stated that I wanted to make her my wife and would like their approval and blessings before I left.

Their approval and blessings were granted us and we sailed from Europe, going by way of Antwerpen and New York. We arrived in Utah on June 27, 1903. On this voyage across the ocean, I learned to love her more than ever and on 19 August 1903 we were married in the Salt Lake Temple by Elder John R. Winder, president of the Salt Lake Temple at that time.

The first home we established was in Clinton, Davis County, Utah. We moved there on 5 September 1903. With 20 acres and a two-room house, we set up housekeeping. The first few years were especially rough and lonely for Laura. Coming over from the old country, she had left friends, neighbors, and family behind. Her understanding and ability to speak the English language was limited and she had to adjust to new ways of living, new friends and a different kind of people. Mother Beus helped her very much to make friends and learn to speak English.

Our oldest daughter, Ellen, was born on January 11, 1906 at Clinton. I had engaged Dr. Ezra Rich of Ogden to take care of Laura, and when the time arrived and she needed him, he arrived too late. He had stopped on the way to shoe his horse. A lady in the neighborhood named Mrs. Owens was with Laura and being experienced, everything was taken care of. Due to a very bad case of whooping cough, which she acquired at the tender age of five weeks, Ellen was blessed at home. My father, James Beus blessed her on 19 January 1906 and we gave her the name of Ellen D. Beus.

On November 22, 1907, our second daughter arrived in our home. She was blessed by Charles Mitchell and given the name Marie Iva Beus, on February 2, 1908.

In 1909 we sold our farm in Clinton and moved to the town of Delta, in Millard County, on what was known as the Carry Act Project. For a year we lived there under a large tent, and did our best to promote the project. However, things did not work out as we had expected they would and in the spring of 1910, we came back and settled again in Clinton.

Shortly after our return to Clinton, we were blessed with arrival of a third daughter in our home. Clara D. Beus was born on 27 June 1910. I blessed and gave her a name on 7 August 1910.

Two years later, 27 July 1912, we were once again blessed with the addition of a fourth daughter. She was given the name Elsie Beus on September 1, 1912, with my blessing and thanks to our Father in Heaven.

We were then blessed with two wonderful sons, Charles Alphonse Beus, on June 10, 1914, and Elmer James on September 18, 1918. Both were born while living in Clinton.

[The following insertions are from two of his daughters and one nephew.]

"We had lots of fun riding in the horse and buggy. All father could afford was a one-seated buggy. He made a board seat t fit in the back and then fastened a strap from one side to the other across our backs to keep us from falling out if we should drop asleep. Many times we rode like this from Clinton to Hooper. It was fun in the summer especially. I can still hear the frogs singing their evening song, and we would count the stars as they came out one by one and listen to the clip clop of the horses feet which would almost lull us to sleep before we got home. In the winter, father would heat some bricks in the oven to keep our feet warm. Father was Justice of the Peace, and it was his responsibility to attend the dances. I remember one night mother sitting home waiting for him to come. Sometimes people would get quite rough at the dances. One man by the name of Jack Light used to give Father a rough time. On this particular night, this Mr. Light chased him home and mother sat in the dark with a poker in her hand ready to help him if necessary. In those days, a lamp was the only light we had. Seldom did a day go by but what a tramp or two knocked at the door and asked for food.

The 4th and 24th of July celebration days were spent in Hooper, and we really had a wonderful time. We would spend the whole day there. Ball games would be held in the afternoon between Hooper and Clinton. How we did yell. In the evening, fireworks were set off. We surely had a lot of fun."

"I think we had a Ford in those days, but it could have been a horse and buggy. Dad and Mother would load it full of food and children and away we would go to Weber Canyon or the likes and set up camp. They were cosy camps, the folks had a knack of making it feel like an outside home. A mirror nailed to the tree, the soap and towel on some branch, and a bonfire banked with rocks. To this day, the poignant odor of bacon, potatoes and onions frying over an open fire give me a nostalgic feeling for the past. Dad would take we children on long hikes into the mountains and we would pick elderberries, chokecherries, wildflowers and, oh yes, milkweeds we would break so the milk would rise to the top and we would make gum out of the sticky residue. Dad and Mother would help us make fish poles out of sticks, string, and bent pins so we could fish in the river which we always managed to camp by.

Dad and Mother loved nature and they taught me to love our God-given beauty, which in this day and age so many have forgotten. I can look at a sunrise, a jagged cliff, the ever-changing colors

of leaves, a blade of grass and see beauty because of them.

I remember long winter evenings when we would all sit around the stove and Dad and Mother would read stories aloud to us - "Rebecca of Sunny Brook Farm," Zane Gray's stirring tales, "Little Women." I believe at one time, that between them, they had read every book in the Carnegie Library. Those were wonderful evenings. When it was time for bed, Dad had us all kneel around our chairs and we would have family prayer."

"I remember a humorous incident involving Uncle Charlie. It was when the family owned a Model "T" Ford. He decided to take it apart and overhaul it himself, which he did. His brother, J. R. loaded up the family and came over to Charlie's, where Charlie had loaded up his family in the newly-overhauled auto, so the two families could go on a ride together. Charlie got in the Model "T", pushed (or pulled) the necessary levers to get it going in low gear, when lo, and behold, it started backwards! He had hooked it up wrong when putting it back together.

In 1919 we moved farther down into the town of Clinton onto what was called the Fuit homestead. I built a small store and set up business. Due to the depression, farm products being so low in price and having a family of eight to support, it became necessary in the fall of 1922 to sell the farm and move to Ogden. We bought a home on 2768 Liberty Avenue and I began working as Sperry Mills. While living on Liberty Avenue, our three oldest daughters grew up, married and began to establish homes of their own.

We lived on Liberty Avenue until the fall of 1930, when we again moved, and this time it was to 619 Cross Street.

We moved from Cross Street to 150 33rd Street in 1935, where we live today. Our family of eight had now diminished to three, through marriage

In civil affairs such as politics I took little part. My actions were on the religious side.

My first duties, after moving to the Ogden Fifth Ward were with a group of boys who thought they were too old to be boy scouts and too young to be M-Men. I took them out and worked with them. There were five boys when I started in the early winter of 1923. By the following spring my group of five boys had grown to a group of 35.

There was at this time three vacancies in the presidency of the quorum of Seventies that I was in. President Levi Edger Young came up to fill these and set those chosen apart. He came and shook hands with me and wanted to know what I was doing. I told him that I was doing as little as I possibly could.

The Fifth Ward consisted mainly of doctors and lawyers. After President Young had looked over the list which had been given to him, he got up and said, "Are these all the names you have to fill these vacancies?" The bishop answered, "Yes, that is all the names we have chosen." President Young crumpled up the paper and said he was going to pick them out himself. He did so, and

chose John R. Henderson, Malcom W. Watson, and myself, saying, "These are the men I want."

[Charles Paul was active in many other church positions during his life. He was ordained a High Priest on March 1, 1931 and served as High Priest group leader for many years.]

In closing, I bear my testimony to the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ as restored through the Prophet Joseph Smith in these latter days, and to the divinity of the Messiah Jesus Christ and the Prophet Joseph Smith.

Laura Sophia Dieu

I was born in Belgium July 6, 1887 at Saint Nicolas, Liege, Belgium, daughter of Alphonse Dieu and Marie Catherine Delva. I was born and raised in the Catholic Church, until I was about fifteen years old. My mother was a very strong Catholic, but my father didn't believe too much in it. Most of his folks were very strong Catholics. Some of them held high positions in that church. But Father read the Bible a lot and was pretty well posted in it. Mother went to church quite regular and the rest of us children went too every Sunday.

My father served in the army for a good many years, and he liked it. When his term was finished, he liked his general so well he asked if he stay with him as a cook. He really was a good cook. The general thought it was a good idea, so he let him stay, and he really enjoyed doing it. I really don't know how long he did stay.

He used to tell us a lot about the war in 1870[probably the Franco-Prussian War]. What a terrible war it was. I remember him telling us about his mother making kettles of soup and big pots of coffee for the poor soldiers. They used to pass quite close to where Grandmother lived, and many a time she knew when they were coming and she always had a little something for them. She was so sorry for them and she felt she was helping a little, and the soldiers were very grateful for it.

Father had a misfortune when he was released from the army. He went through the war in 1870 and served his long term without a scratch, but coming home when he got off at the station the train hit him. He said he looked on both sides of him, but failed to see this fast-coming train. He was injured pretty bad. The doctors had to take one leg off and four toes from the other foot, and they had to take little pieces of crushed bones from different parts of his body. He was in the hospital for a long time. This all happened before he was married.

Father did not get married until he was thirty-three years old and my mother was twenty-seven years old. After his accident he learned to make shoes and made his living at it. He raised seven children and made shoes for all of us; very good looking shoes too. I never bought a pair of shoes until I was seventeen years old. Mother knitted all of our stockings.

Dad was always very good natured and he was a good singer. Mother liked to sing, but not so much as Dad. Mother was more quiet and a very hard worker.

I went to school until I was fifteen years old. I used to go to school, and then I would come home and take care of our neighbor's children. That was my job, but I liked that very much. At one time I worked in a shoe factory. Father didn't want me to, but I went for a while and I liked it very much.

My job in the shoe factory was to put the design on the shoes and make button holes. At that time they wore the high-top shoes. When I quit, I helped Father in his shoe shop part of the time and I got so that I could put a patch on a shoe and do it very good. On Saturday evening, my job was to see that all the shoes were polished so we would be ready to go to Sunday School. Mother had a lot of work to do, but she never complained. She used to do all the buying for Dad too, such as bu; ying the leather, nails, thread and different things to make the shoes. She was very good at it. Besides that she had the house to keep up and take care of us children, but Dad and Mother pulled together and helped one another out. Many times when Mother came back from shopping Father had the meals ready. He was a good hand at making soup and cooking meat, etc.

Father had a cousin, named Joseph Dieu, who couldn't read nor write. I don't believe he ever went to school. He lived at Villers le Bouillet. He got acquainted with the Mormon missionaries and he felt very bad because he couldn't read nor write. They used to talk a lot about the Book of Mormon. He bought one and every time he met someone who could read he would ask them to read a chapter out of it for him. His desires were so great to read that when he was baptized and confirmed, he was told if his faith was strong enough he would be able to read for himself. It was through him that the missionaries came to our place. Cousin Joseph came to see Father one day and pulled out a Book of Mormon from his picket and began to read. Father just couldn't believe it, because he knew that Joseph couldn't read, and he told Cousin Joseph that he would like to see these missionaries.

The missionaries came, but they had quite a hard time to find us. Our main name is "Dieu", meaning "God". That part of the town was new to the missionaries and when they would ask where Dieu lived, the people could see they were strangers, so they would look up to the sky and say . . . "up there somewhere." They were just having fun with them. A little farther down the road a lady told them where to find us. I was there the first time. Father asked them all kinds of questions, and I believe they were quite surprised, because he did ask them so many questions. Mother fixed lunch for them before they went away, and when ever the missionaries came she always fixed dinner for them. Mother liked them from the first visit. After that they went to meetings, held cottage meetings, etc., and they liked that. They were ready to ask to be baptized

and the missionaries didn't call for a long time and the folks were worried. They didn't know that the missionaries were out of town holding a conference, and going other places. One night Mother prayed before she went to bed about it. She had a dream and she saw three elderly men at the head of the twelve apostles, representing the church and when she got up in the morning she felt a lot better, and she told Father, "I believe that all is well." The missionaries came back the next day, and they were baptized soon after. Their faith was very strong.

One time they were having conference at Liege and Apostle Francis M. Lyman was going to be the speaker. Father had a very bad sore foot. He had, had a callous on the bottom of it and had tried to cut it off with a razor. He cut if off alright, and made it bleed. It caused a big sore, infection set in and it wouldn't heal. The doctor told him not to walk on it, but he wanted to go to conference so bad, that he went anyway and his foot hurt him awful. It was quite an occasion to see and hear an apostle talk and they were so thrilled with the meeting. The Elders brought him home. Charlie Beus was one of them. They took his shoe and sock off and his foot looked very bad and he asked the Elders to administer to him and when he got up the next morning his foot was healed. He went for a long time and had no trouble with it, but later on he kept walking on it and he was a very heavy man and it caused the sore to open up again and it was very hard on him and on Mother too.

Mother and Father were the first ones to be baptized. I remember when they told us what they had to do, we were so afraid. Father weighed about two-hundred and fifty pounds. We were afraid they wouldn't be able to pull him out of the water, and it was a big relief to us when they came back. They were baptized July 16, 1902 by Charles P. Beus and Willard T. Cannon.

The first meeting I attended was a cottage meeting at our house. I was working out at that time, and I came home for the meeting. I was little late and I didn't know if I should go in or not, but

Mother saw me and she made me come in. They were singing. "We Thank Thee O God for a Prophet" and I liked that so well, and I still do. The other hymn was "Come, Come Ye Saints." I started to go to Sunday School and meeting with my brothers and sisters. We had to go a long way to go to church. Sunday School started at ten o'clock and meeting after that. We went at Scraing in the morning. It was four or five miles there and then that far to get back, and at night we went at Liege, almost as far, and we didn't think anything of it. I was baptized Sept. of 1902. Julius and Lucy were baptized the same day. Marie, Emilie and Gabriel C. were baptized the 16th day of May 1903 by Charles P. Beus, and were confirmed the same day by D. P. Cheney.

I left home for America June 14th and sailed 1903 from Antwerp on the 15th, arriving in Ogden, June the 27th with Elder Charles P. Beus. The next one to come over was He came Julius. about a year after I came. Then my sister Therese and her husband came about five years later. The rest of the family came in 1910. They didn't have very pleasant trip here. Mother took sick and at Quebec, Canada she was operated for on appendicitis. They really were afraid she wouldn't pull through. She was ill, very but Mother had great She asked faith. Elders the administer to her and she knew all would be well, and that she would be able to finish her trip and be here with her children once more. She hadn't seen me for seven long years. Father and Marie stayed at a hotel close bу until

Mother was able to travel once more, and it was very hard for them too. Lucie, and Emilie and Gabriel C. came on together the rest of the way here.

The people at Quebec talked French. They were very nice to Father and Mother and Marie. They wanted them to stay and live in Quebec. One of the Priests there offered to give them a nice home and set Father up in business if they would give up going to Zion and stay there, but my folks wanted to come on here and they did, as soon as Mother was well enough to travel.

My time of courtship was short and sweet. Only from June 27th until August 19th. I was married to Charles P. Beus, in the Salt Lake Temple and I'll say I never regretted it. We have always been happy together. We have raised six fine children, four girls and two boys and we are very proud of them. They are all married, happy and doing fine. And now we have 18 grand-children, one haveing passed away. A very sweet little fellow named "Don." He was thirteen years old. He was Ellen's boy.

I never worked too much in the church. I was the president of the Primary in the Clinton Ward during the World War in 1918, and I worked in the genealogy in the Twenty-first Ward. I have been a Relief Society teacher for about twenty-five years and am still going.

[The following is added by her daughter, Ellen D. Thurgood.]

Mother was a wonderful homemaker and companion. We will always cherish her cheerful smile and the loving way she would greet us when we came home. If our hearts were heavy with worry and care, they seemed to be lifted as we sat and visited with her. She never complained, but always saw the brighter side of life. She had a lot of faith and courage and faced whatever came to her with courage. I never recall that she was afraid of anything. A drunk knocked on our door one time at 3 a.m. in the morning. Her only comment was, "Poor fellow, he just needed a little help. He was lost and couldn't find his way." She had an extra special attitude. One time during the final years of her life, she lost her set of house keys. When telling about the incident she said, "You know, if I had been younger I would have gotten mad at myself, but I thought it over and decided I didn't have anything better to do with my time anyway, so why get upset over hunting for them. I felt sure I would eventually find them."

Relief Society brought much joy into Mother's life. She attended regularly and helped much with the quilting. Visiting teaching was important to her and she was faithful to her calling as long as her legs would carry her.

Mother and Dad celebrated their golden wedding anniversary with an open house at their home, on August 19th, 1953. All of the children and many of their 17 grandchildren returned home to celebrate it with them. It was a happy occasion

Mother loved to crochet. Her hands were never idle. She crocheted a beautiful bedspread, buying all her thread from J. C. Penney's. When she purchased so much thread, J. C. Penney's became interested in her project and asked Mother if they could display her bedspread when it was completed. She willingly agreed to let them have it on display in their store. Later, Clara bought the bedspread from Mother. Children and grandchildren received crocheting from Mother. She started early in the year making birthday gifts and Christmas gifts. Each one received some of her lovely work at Christmas and held these gifts in cherished remembrance.

Christmas was a special time with Mother. She loved this season of the year. Each year her little artificial tree went up and each year it seemed to glitter and shine more brightly. Her Christmas trees reflected her bright smile and cheerful spirit.

Mother's kitchen was a special place too. The round table was never out of place. Her children and grandchildren alike, always will remember her soups and home-made bread. It always seemed she had some on cooking when we went there, and we really enjoyed sitting down with them both to enjoy her simple meals. Grandpa's special chair was in the same corner year after year. He would always excuse himself when he was through eating and ask Grandmother if he could help with the dishes, complimenting her also on her good food.

There were always house plants in her home. Mother had a green thumb and her plants responded to her care. Every year there was a bed of Petunias in the front yard. She was especially concerned about her flowers getting enough water, and she thoroughly enjoyed caring for her plants.

During her life Mother had two operations which were really serious. Ninety percent of her colon was removed and eight-five percent of her stomach during the second operation. Her faith, courage and determination to get well never failed her. After one operation, while she was still recovering, the doctor came in to see her and was rather proud in commenting about the success he had in performing the operation. Mother spoke up and said, "Doctor, there is one you have failed to recognize in this." She loved them dearly and was ever trying to comfort them and ready to listen to their problems and help them out if she could. She never considered herself old. When they would call about how they felt, she would say, "Oh, they are just growing old."

She loved her family and they loved her. After father passed away, she made a trip by plane to Portland and then to California. Clara accompanied her as far as Marie and John's. She enjoyed this trip very much, spending Christmas with Marie, John and family.

Mother lived four years after Father passed away. She passed away the day before Father's birthday, which was the 29th of January. I am sure that is the way he wanted it.

Mother played the piano for the Primary, taught Sunday School and was a Counselor in the young ladies M.I.A. Those were happy days. Mother attended the Weber Academy, now known as Weber State College. One of her favorite teachers was David O. McKay. She graduated with a teachers certificate and taught school for two years at Warren, Utah.

About that time, a special young man came into her life. James Gilbert Belnap was a widower with two small children. Their friendship grew into love and they were married in the Salt Lake Temple on May 10, 1906. They both grew up on farms, so hard work was not new to them. They lived in Hooper for a while then to Ogden and then to West Warren, where Dad built a house for them. Their family was growing. By then Mother had given

birth to four children. At that time they left the farm and moved to Wyoming, where Dad worked on the railroad.

After a few years they moved back to Salt Lake City, then to Garfield and from Garfield to Cedar Fort, Utah, where they worked on a dry farm for Doctor Holbrook. That was hard work for Mother. By then she had two more babies. They moved back to Salt Lake and Dad went to work once more for the Railroad. There tragedy struck and the family was stricken with diphtheria. It was there Erma died at the age of ten years.

After nine children Dad took sick and Mother had to go to work to support the family. Dad died June 24, 1936, and Mother had to support the family as well as raise them. She worked as a cook at Keeleys for many years and as a cook at Fort Douglas.

World War II came along and five of the boys were drafted into the service. All were overseas at the same time, and all in different places. Those were really hard times for Mother. She was overjoyed when a letter would finally come from one of them. Mother was proud of her boys.

Her youngest son Kenneth was not able to go in the service and wanted to go on a mission. This pleased Mother very much and she did many jobs to help support him. She did baby sitting and house work. One job she enjoyed very much was answering the office phone for her son-in-law, who was in for himself. Through it all she was never too tired or too busy to tend her grandchildren and they all loved her. I'm sure we all imposed on her.

Her first son George never married, and it was he who paid the rent and took care of Mother. Her children were married, with homes of their own and Mother could stay at home now. She enjoyed going to church and once more taking an active part. She gave the spiritual living lesson in Relief Society and was a visiting teacher. She went to the temple often. She loved to watch T.V. and especially enjoyed the wrestles. At times she worked harder than they did. She always kept her hands busy. She loved to crochet, and one year for Christmas she made each of her seven children a crocheted table cloth. She made many chair back sets. She entered these things in the state fair and received many blue ribbons. They are really a keepsake for her family.

By now Mother's health was not good, and just 21 years after her husband's death she passed away, on June 24, 1957. She passed away at the age of 71. She left a posterity of 9 children, 17 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.

James Gilbert Belnap

James Gilbert Belnap was born January 7, 1877 in Blaine, Davis County, Utah; now South Weber County, the second son William James and Eliza Ann Watts. He married Elnora Cox June 7, 1899 in the Salt Lake Temple. They had two children before she passed away March 3, 1904. The names of the two children are: James Junior, born December 12, 1900 in Hooper, Utah and Nora Lavon, born January 18, 1902 in Hooper, Utah.

He was very athletic and loved music. After school and on Saturdays he could be found in the barn turning somersaults and having a great time. He played the French Horn in the Hooper Band and could turn somersaults backwards faster than most people could jump frontwards.

He had been a widower for two years when he fell in love with Chloe May Beus, my mother. They were married May 10, 1906 in the Salt Lake Temple. They were the parents of six boys and three girls. One daughter, Erma, died at the age of ten. They lived for a while in Hooper, Utah and then moved to Ogden, Utah. From Ogden they moved to Reese, Utah, which is now Warren, Utah. It was in West Warren, Utah that Dad built his first home. At that time he was a farmer. He left the farm to go to work for the railroad.

His work on the railroad took them to Point of Rock, Wyoming. Dad was a Maintainer on the

railroad and was later transferred to Tipton, Wyoming. That was a watering stop for the trains. There were no places on the trains for the men to eat, so Mother made sack lunches for them. There was no school in Tipton, so the folks moved back to Salt Lake so that the children could attend school. At this time he was working as a machinist for the railroad in the round house in Salt Lake. Dad decided to try farming again, and so they moved to Cedar Valley, Utah where he worked for Dr. Horace Holbrook on his dry farm. That was real hard work for both Dad and Mother — a dry farm is no fun! Mother worked right beside Dad, but to we kids it was a lark hauling rock and blasting out cedar trees to clear more land. Mother would make a big pan of sandwiches and we would sit in the shade of the trees and have a picnic. While in Cedar Valley Dad took an active part again playing baseball. Between innings, he would entertain the crowd by turning back flips. He was also president of the Young Men's Mutual Association of the church.

Dad moved the family back to Salt Lake and again went to work for the railroad. He bought a house with some land and would work the farm in the day time. He worked the afternoon shift at

the railroad, getting home in the wee hours of the morning.

After a while his health broke and Mother went to work to finish raising the family. While Mother was at work, Dad used to gather all the kids in the neighborhood and teach them how to tumble. He was called the "Peppermint Man." When any of the neighborhood kids were sick, he would leave peppermint candies on the window sills. He was a good man and loved by all. He died June 24, 1936 at the age of 59. Mom and Dad now have a living posterity of 18 grandchildren and 29 great-grandchildren.

HEBER HILL BEUS AND SINDIA CATHERINA CHILD

Heber Hill Beus

Heber Hill Beus was born in Hooper, Utah, April 18, 1888. His parents were James Beus and Clarinda Cynthia Hill. His early years were spent in Hooper, where he was taken to church by his parents and taught to pray for help and guidance. He was baptized at eight years of age by Oley Olsen.

He attended school in Hooper as far as it went, then spent about two years in college, where he received his letter in basketball. At this time his father had a bad accident. As a result of some loud noises his team became frightened and his father fell and was run over by the wagon. This made it necessary for Heber to quit school and come home to run the farm, as he was the only boy at home. With his father directing the work, Heber ran the farm for a number of years. He also played baseball, for he loved sports and was very good in all of them. At this time he also played a

horn in the Hooper band.

Heber married Sindia Child, Oct. 20, 1910 in the Salt Lake Temple. The ceremony was performed by Antone H. Lund. They lived in Hooper on the farm for seven years, then they moved to Vernal, where he farmed and raised good crops, but there was no market for them. The flu hit Vernal so hard they became discouraged and made plans to return. His wife and children were sent ahead by train and he followed as soon as he could with a wagon, four good head of horses and all his possessions. This experience is given in his own words:

"As I prepared to load my wagon I became ill. A neighbor stopped to chat and said 'You are getting the flu. You had better get out of town or they will put you in the pest house.' There were no hospitals, and people were dying of the flu. I hurried with my wagon and started for Ogden. The further I went the sicker I became. became confused and took the wrong road. When I realized this I cut across the field to get back to the right road, mired in the mud to the axles, but was able to reach the road. About 65 miles out of Vernal I met a man on his way to Price with his wife and children. He was having a bad time because his load was too heavy for his horses to pull. My horses were in good shape, but I

was really sick, so we pooled our equipment and traveled together. When we arrived at Price, some friends helped me to a room so I would not be confined to a sick bed. I felt I must keep going to make it to Ogden. I felt if I were confined to the pest house I would surely die. The next morning friends put the horses and wagon on the freight train and I rode with the horses to Provo. At Provo the train stopped and I was very much afraid of being put off the train, so I jumped off and went over to a park, which was just across the street, and sat down by a tree. I saw a man cross the park and come straight toward me. It was Mr. MacKay, brother of Pres. David MacKay. He said 'What can I do for you, Mr. Beus?' I told him I had to get to Ogden. He bought me a ticket on the Bamberger, helped me to a seat, and told me not to move out of that seat until I got to Ogden. The train stopped in Salt Lake, but I stayed in the seat until I arrived in Ogden. I got off the train, and walked to the viaduct to catch a ride to Hooper. Suddenly the sickness left me and I was fine."

He bought a small place in Clinton. Later wishing to acquire a larger place he signed a contract for a place in Kanesville, only to find it was fraudulent. The man he bought the place from was a bishop, and Heber trusted him too far. He took everything they had and they went in the street with nothing. This bishop was later excommunicated from the church for taking tithing for his own use.

Heber then moved his family to his mother's old place in Hooper and went to work for the railroad cutoff and the sugar factory. They next moved to Ogden, where he went to work for the Weber Central Dairy. He worked for the dairy for 33 years and retired April 1, 1957.

Heber's religious activities included teaching a Deacons class, Mutual class, Sunday School Superintendency, ward teacher and teaching the Adult Aaronic and the Gospel Doctrine class. He also served on a stake mission.

Heber and Sindia were the parents of three sons: Lloyd, James Warren and Raymon, and four daughters: Nellie, Ruby, Margaret and Virginia. All of the sons were in the Second World War. The youngest son, Raymon, lost his life in the conflict.

Heber passed away on the morning of Jan 29, 1976.

Sindia Catherina Child



Sindia's parents were very strict parents. She remembered being disciplined with her younger brother, Ervin, by being tied to the bedpost with a piece of string which they could easily break if they dared.

Sindia was faithful in attending Primary and Sunday School. She helped her married brothers and sisters by tending their children and doing housework for them.

Sindia and her sister Jennie loved to dance, and tried to attend every dance held in Hooper. Once, Bishop Child offered them money if they would stay home from a dance and they agreed to this until they heard the dance music, then they couldn't resist going.

She and Jennie helped their mother with her work so she could travel about with Bishop Child. These trips were slow because of having to travel by horses and buggy. When Sindia was older she enjoyed driving a team and buggy and often took her children visiting with her in the buggy.

Sindia was married to Heber Hill Beus in the Salt Lake Temple on October 26, 1910. They traveled to Ogden by horse and buggy, then on to Salt Lake City on the Bamberger. She was the devoted mother of four girls: Nellie, Ruby, Margaret and Virginia and three boys: Lloyd, Warren and Raymon.

She had a reputation of being a very good cook. Her bread and rolls were the envy of the neighborhood. Each Sunday she prepared a noon meal complete with pie or cake or both. Every Monday she was up early and had her washing on the line before most neighbors were up.

Sindia had a special gift, in that she sensed when a loved one was in danger, and at times she prevented that danger from happening. She had a strong testimony of the gospel, and listened to the promptings of our Heavenly Father.

She died in her home in Ogden, Utah on July 4, 1969.

Iva Marian Beus

I was born the 6th day of November 1890, at Hooper, Weber Co., Utah, the tenth child of James Beus and Clarinda Cynthia Hill. My father, James Beus was born the 15Th day of December, 1840 at Pramol, Piedmont, Italy. My mother, Clarinda Cynthia Hill, was born the 19th day of October 1848 in the Pioneer Park, Salt Lake City. They were married the 19th of October 1867 in the Endowment House by Apostle Wilford Woodruff. Their first home was in Ogden, but in 1878 they bought a farm and moved to Hooper. Father died the 3rd day of May 1911 at Hooper, and was buried in Ogden. Then mother and I moved to Ogden in 1920 and made several moves until mother died the 28th of December 1939 at Salt Lake City. She was buried in Ogden.

They were blessed with children, Joseph and Josephus (twins), born 23rd March 1868. Because of an accident they were premature and they only lived a few hours. James Richard Beus was born 5th April 1869, George Washington Beus was born 11 July 1871 and died 27th August 1874, Clarinda Cynthia was born September 1876 and died 7 October 1876. Charles Paul Beus was born 29th Jan. 1880. All of these were born in Ogden. Chloe May Beus was born 24th August 1885. Heber Hill Beus was born 18 April 1888 and I was born the 6th November 1890 at Hooper.

My grandparents were Michael Beus, born 29th April at Pramol, Piedmont, Italy, and Marianne Combe, born 7th March 1814 at Martinat, Italy. George Washington Hill was born 5th March 1822 at Amesville, Athens Co., Ohio and Cynthia Utley Stewart was 15th January 1823 at Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

My childhood days were spent on the farm at Hooper, where I first attended school in the West Hooper school house, then later in grades 5 to 8 I went to the adobe central school, about one mile east of home. After graduating from the 8th grade, I took

up study playing organ and piano for awhile. Then later on I attended school at the Weber Academy at Ogden.

A religious atmosphere predominated in our home. Father went on a mission to Switzerland and Italy from 1881 to 1883, James R. went on a mission to Ireland and Charles Paul went on a mission to Belgium. The expense of these missions and difficulties, in sickness and false friends

kept us from gaining very much of worldly goods. However we had a friendly, happy home, with family games and some canyon trips in the covered wagon. We went as a family to church and all took active parts in church organizations and civic activities.

My church activity started when I was fourteen years of age. I was secretary in Primary. At age sixteen I began teaching in MIA and later was a counselor in the presidency of the MIA. I was superintendent of religion class from age 18 until age 22. When mother and I moved to Ogden, I again worked in the church, first as a teacher in Sunday School, then on the MIA stake board. In 1923 I left for a mission to the central states, with headquarters in Independence, Missouri. Samuel O. Bennion was Mission President. I had some success and some disappointments, but feel that I did a good job. When I returned home and could not get work in Ogden, we moved to Salt Lake City in 1928. In Salt Lake City, I taught the Gleaner girls in the 17th ward, and later on moved to the 27th ward, where I held several positions: teacher in genealogy class, gospel doctrine class in Sunday School. Then for a number of years I was on the MIA stake board, then on the Sunday School stake board at the same time. I did some teaching in ward Sunday School.

The winter of 1911 and 1912 mother and I moved to Logan, where I began my genealogy work, and mother did temple work. Aunt Ruthinda Hill Moench had obtained some pamphlets on the Hill people and she felt sure that they were our people. So when we got to her home I completed that work. I got the family groups together and made two books, one for her and one for mother. Later on Mary Hill copied a book for her father, Richard Hill. While doing this work we had a very unusual experience. One evening, I was at a little table working on the genealogy, which was nearly completed. A meeting had been called which Uncle Richard and Uncle John had agreed to attend. On this particular evening Aunt Ruthinda thought that I had not written to Uncle John and I told her that I had. But she insisted that I had not. Mother went outside for a walk and Aunt Ruthinda came and stood by me and began moaning and threw up her arms and began shaking all over in her rage. I jumped up, took hold of her to set her down in a chair, but she was so stiff that she just lay back, but was unconscious. I called to mother and we worked over her until she came to, but was still moaning. During the day, Aunt Ruthinda went out giving treatments and would come home all unstrung and put out at everything that went on. Mother and I prayed, but as it was her house only we were protected. She was possessed of an evil spirit and that influence was all through the house. She finally went to bed and insisted that we do the same. She insisted that all lights be turned out. All throughout the night noises were heard, such as tapping windows. The next morning she and mother went to the temple, and I was there I had some housework to do and one of the jobs was cleaning the kitchen floor. While doing that I kept looking up expecting to see someone as I knew I was not alone. In the afternoon I was in the other room working on the records and there came a noise as if something was tumbling down the stairs, I jumped up and ran out of the house. It was awfully hard to go back in the house again, to work on the records, but I did. This condition continued for five days. In the night I was grabbed by the arm and the bed was shaken. The next day, mother and I left Logan and went to Franklin, Idaho. I was very ill and so stayed for two weeks, when Jane Hill, my cousin, and a trained nurse, took care of me. This experience left me very nervous for a long time.

While father was on his mission he obtained some records of his people and had temple work done for them. Before we left Hooper Uncle Paul obtained a pedigree chart of the Beus family. They brought it to me to make the genealogy records out and trace relationships. It took me all one winter to complete it, but I traced the direct line back to about 1500. We did not have all the dates, so I took the records and chart to Archibald F. Bennett (the head of the Genealogical Society) and he approved of it. Therefore I made the temple sheets and the work was done for these people.

Sometime later I dreamed that father came and took me to his mother's house (both had died before this time). They went to a table with shelves and drawers and got out some papers. Then they talked for a while, they brought the papers to me and said for me to take care of them. The next morning I told mother that I thought father wanted me to work on the Combe line. Soon after that the way opened up and I got the work going. Through correspondence I had three men work for me. Some got a little and the last one (Jean Jolly) did most of it, and I got in touch with him through James L. Barker. This took the Combe line to about 1500, but could go no further back as the records before that date had been burned. Then I hired a man here in the genealogical society to go over records and translate them into English, and I got a good supply of sheets. These filled

in more family names on the direct line, and also traced on other lines of our relatives. All of these have been sent to the temple. On December 15, 1937 we had a large number of relatives come to the Salt Lake Temple and spend two hours sealing all that had then been made ready.

In 1925 when I returned from my mission I could not get work in Ogden. They had a stake genealogy class in our stake so I took my Beus and Combe records to the meeting. After examining them Brothers Smith and Summerhays (the presiding officers in the Salt Lake Genealogy Society) invited me to go to Salt Lake City and work in the genealogy research department. I accepted the call and we moved to Salt Lake City for that work. But as there was a depression on, there was not enough to keep us all busy, and I was the last employee. I got less, and the last month I worked there I got \$35.00 pay. We could not pay rent and live on that. Mother and I prayed about it and I dreamed that I was in a large building and met a heavy set, dark complexioned man, who was real nice to me. The next morning I was called to come and work for the Beneficial Life Insurance Company. I stayed with that company for 25 years. The work was pleasant and many fine people worked there. Even now, after having been retired for 25 years, I am still invited to their Christmas and other special parties and events.

In 1951 I met Daniel Earl Bishop and we were married on the 21st of September 1951 in the Salt Lake Temple by President Robert L. Young. We had several nice trips together: three to the north west, one to the east coast, visiting important cities and church centers, also the Palmyra Pageant. We took several trips to southern and eastern Utah and Wyoming. While at home we both did temple work and were active in church duties. No doubt, we would have had more trips but illness has kept us home. Earl had three operations and was left with a paralyzed leg. I have had my share of sickness, so we are not so active, but are trying to live our religion as best we can. I go to Sacrament meeting and Relief Society when I can. On Sunday mornings we have the Priesthood lessons and other church papers. It is good that we are here together, as we read, use cassettes, have some music, and not much TV, as programs are not to our liking. However, we are studying and learning a lot more about the gospel and other worthwile subjects that we can get.

I have a strong testimony of the gospel and have had many incidents that have built my faith. One incident I will tell. While in the mission field I labored much among the reorganites. One evening a large group of their leaders asked Elder Purson Corbett and I to meet with them and talk on subjects handed to us after the meeting began. We did, and after singing and prayer the papers were handed to us. My subjects were "Adam God" and "blood atonement". I had never given these subjects much study, so had to depend upon the Lord. I was the first speaker and I never prayed harder or more sincerely than I did then. I talked twenty minutes and they had no comments. Then Elder Corbett talked about "priesthood succession" and "plural marriage." After meeting we were walking home and he asked me where I got all that information. I told him the Lord gave it to me as it was needed. Many times my prayers have been answered. Earl and I study, pray and enjoy each other. We are able to keep up our home and do the necessary work and we are very happy. Earl is now 92 years old and I am 86, so not too spry, but we are thankful for the help we are getting from relatives and the blessings from the Lord each day.

[Readers of this history will have learned that Aunt Iva, as she is known to all the relatives, has been busily engaged in genealogical research on family lines for many years. Her contributions in this area have been very great. We are indebted to her for most of the ancestral information on Michael and Marianne as well as much on other family lines. She has been a great example and inspiration to all of us who have visited her over the years. At this writing, April 1984, she is living in Salt Lake City alone, her husband, Earl, having passed away 16 Nov. 1981. She is now 93 years old, not quite as spry as she used to be, but quick of mind and a joy to visit.]

Daniel Earl Bishop

My parents moved to Hinckley when I was a baby, in 1886, and I lived there for 58 years. I moved to Tooele in 1944. In Hinckley our neighbors were few and a long way apart. My boy friends were the Meacham and Packs. All during my school days it was hard going. I had to walk one and one-quarter miles in mud and cold weather to get to school. I was always cold and wet and I had the earache all the time until I was 12 years old, and oh how I suffered. Only those who have it can tell. I grew up as boys do, was out of school until late in the fall and early in the spring. So I didn't get much. The railroad only went as far south as Nephi. No doctors in the country. No way to go anywhere, only by horseback or wagon. But we kids had fun in our way of looking at it.

My mother died when I was 14, leaving eight boys and one girl, the baby only one week old. From then on life was hard and lonesome. I lived with my Uncle Charlie Calroon in the desert for two years. Then I began to travel around. I spent one summer in Wyoming working on the railroad and one summer in Idaho working on the railroad and breaking ground for the Mackay smelter. I would always go home for the winter times. When I was 17 I worked for a fellow in Deep Creek, west of Hinckley 150 miles, on a ranch for two summers. The last year I went to school was in 1903-04, at Fillmore. I didn't have any home life after mother died.

At the age of 19 I was sent on a mission and came home in 1906. I was married that year. We had seven children, two of whom died and five are still living.

While I lived at Hinckley I served for six years on our town board. I also served for six years on the board of the Deseret Irrigation Company.

I have been active in church work ever since I was 19. I have served in the Elders Quorum Presidency, in the Twenty-First Quorum of Seventy, where I was one of the seven presidents. I served in the YMMIA

twice, also in the Supt. of the Sunday School, two different times and for years I taught classes both in Sunday School and MIA. My testimony of the gospel is stronger now than ever before. I am now 74 years old and for the first time in my life since I was 19 I haven't anything to do in the church, and the reason is my hearing is so bad and also my heart and I have a hard time getting around at night. The Lord has been good to me all the days of my life. I have had many outstanding testimonies of healing. I have been raised from my sick bed by the laying on of hands, by the servants of the Lord. And I have helped to heal others who have been sick, by the laying on of hands. I feel at peace with the world. I hate no one and I know of no enemies that I have. I have made lots of mistakes in my life, as we all do, but that is all in the past and I am trying to forget it. I am always the happiest when I am with my family or with my brothers and sisters. There is nothing that gives me more pleasure than to be at home with my family. I have always

been a home person, so it is my wish that the family will always remember that the home ties come first, and they will not drift away from each other. For I know that family life is a good life.
