1876-1884 Arizona (7+ years)

In the early part of 1876, Louis Philip Cardon accompanied by his son, Emanuel Phillip, left Oxford, Oneida, Idaho for Arizona.

1876-1884 Arizona (7+ years)

- In late 1876 Joseph Samuel Cardon left Idaho to go to Arizona.
- In 1877 Joseph Samuel Cardon settled in Woodruff AZ located 3 miles above Snowflake, AZ.
- In 1878 Louis Philip Cardon moved to Woodruff, AZ.

1876-1884 Arizona (7+ years)

June 7, 1880 U.S. census at Walker (now Taylor), Apache, AZ lists CARDONS:

- **Louis Philip** (age 47), Sara Ann Wellborn (age 50), Susette Stale (Age 44), **Louis Paul** (age 12)
- **Joseph Samuel** (age 22), Selenia Mesenile (age 25). Selenia Vermina (age 4). Joseph Elmer (age 2), Josephine Selenia age (6 mo),
- **Emanuel Phillip** (age 21) and Amelia (age 21) Emanuel A. (age 2). Amy S. (age 3 mo)

1876-1884 Arizona (7+ years)

- Children born to Joseph Samuel and Selenia Mesenile Cardon while in Arizona:
- Sarah Elizabeth (died 1877), Josephine Susette, Leroy Phillip, and Edith.

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Louis Philip Cardon entered Mexico in March, 1884 with his son Louis Paul Cardon (16 yrs old), Sarah Ann Wellborn, his 1ST wife, and Susette Stale, his 2nd wife.

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Joseph Samuel Cardon entered Mexico with Selenia Mesenile Walker his first wife in 1884.

Children born in Mexico to Joseph Samuel and Selenia Mesenile Cardon were: Leonard Jesse, Eugene William, Junius Welborn, Cornelia, Mansel Lorenzo. All were born in Colonia Juarez except Mansel Lorenzo who was born in Colonia Dublan.

Leonard Jesse, Eugene William and Mansel Lorenzo died as children in Mexico.

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Joseph Samuel Cardon Married a 2nd wife, Cornelia Van Dam 9 Feb 1883 in the St George Temple.

A son, James Ellis Cardon, was born 25 Sep 1884 in Taylor, AZ. In 1885 he took Cornelia to Mexico where James Ellis died in 1885. Cornelia returned to Taylor, Arizona and died of typhoid fever on 5 Aug 1885.

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Joseph Samuel Cardon married a 3rd wife, Rhoda McClellan on 24 July 1888 in Colonia Dublan, Mexico.

Eva May, Ethel, Lester Leon, Mabel, William Afton, Earl Preston, Genevieve, Joseph Harold, and Rhoda Fern

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Emanuel Philip Cardon and Amelia Merrick had 11 children: Emanuel Alonso, Amy Sophia, Clarence Philip, Isabelle, Catherine Eltz, Louis Leander, Amelia, Jesse Leo, Lester D., Ernest, and Nellie Sarah.

Emanuel Philip Cardon, Amelia Merrick and their young son, Ernest, are buried in Colonia Dublan.

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Louis Paul Cardon married 1st wife, Ellen Clymena Sanders 9 Oct 1895. Ellen Katie their first child was born in Taylor, AZ on 25 July 1896. They moved from Taylor, Arizona to Colonia Dublan in 1897 where he taught school. In Dublan, were born: Lucille, Gretta, Irene (twin), Paul (twin), Louis Sanders, Mariner Sanders and Isabelle.

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Louis Paul Cardon married a 2nd wife, Edith Jemima Done in Juarez, 23 Feb 1901.

The children born in Dublan were: Louis, Edith, Eva, Paul, Ellen. Children born elsewhere: Mary, Florence, Ethel, Lucy, Thomas Done, Emanuel Done, and Lawrence Done

1884-1912 Mexico (27+ years)



Louis Paul Cardon married a 3rd wife, Mary Irena Pratt on 11 Nov 1903 in Dublan.

The children born in Colonia Dublan were: Parley Pratt, Dora, Wilford Pratt and Stanley Pratt. Born in Binghampton after the exodus were: Bartley Pratt, Helaman Pratt, Edna, Amy, and Orson Pratt.

In Mexico Louis Philip Cardon and Joseph Samuel Cardon

They settled first in Colonia Juarez in 1884. They worked land about 3 miles below Colonia Juarez. However, they learned it was not within the Church land purchase. Hence, they moved to Colonia Juarez and purchased a whole city block, each taking $\frac{1}{2}$ of a block. Joseph Samuel took lands 2-3 miles above Juarez. Later they took 40 acres about 5 miles above Juarez and built a small home close to the foot of the mountain. They sold the property and moved to Colonia Dublan after 1893.

In Dublin, Joseph Samuel Cardon built a brick home. While there, he was chief engineer of the “Big Canal” when he caught typhoid fever and died in 1908.

RESEARCH REPORT

SUBJECT: Colonia Dublan and Juarez deaths and burials.

Answer to question number one: Jean P. Stalle and the PEF. In a list called Names of Persons and Sureties indebted to the PERPETUAL EMIGRATING FUND COMPANY from 1850 to 1877 inclusive, the name of Jean P Stalle and the date 1855 appears on the list (page 153). As of 1877, no payment to the PEF was made and there is no record of payment after that date.

Answer to question number two: Burial plots for the Cardon family in Dublan. The following records states:

Cardon, Joseph Samuel, Dublan Male High Priest Death: 26 Sept. 1908, Typhoid Fever (Record of Members, Form E, 1908, page 76, CR 375 8, reels 1728 and 1729).

Cardon, Louis Phillip, Dublan Male High Priest Death: 9 April 1911, Old Age (Record of Members, Form E, 1911, page 318). In the autobiography of Roade McClellan Cardon, 1877-1967 (MS 13470) this statement was found " Grandfather Cardon died on April 9th, 1911 and was buried at Dublan. (page 33).

Cardon, Selenia. No records found for 1906.

No burial or cemetery records were found for Colonia Dublan.

Answer to question number three: burials in Colonia Juarez for the Wilson family. The following record was found:

Wilson, Lucurgus, Juarez, Male, High Priest, age 83, No death date listed other than 1911, cause of death was old age and result of a fall (Record of Members, Form E, 1911, page 520, CR 375 8, reels 3221-3222). In an oral history with Guy C Wilson, a grandson of Lucurgus, is given a description of the fall that caused the death of his grandfather and the funeral but not the burial (M270 W7483m 1988, pp 27-28).

Wilson, Lois Ann. No records for 1905 were found.

No burial or cemetery records were found for Colonia Juarez.
